- May miss classes from time to time

- May need to defer exams from time to time
- Requires a note taker (volunteer service provided by DSS)
- Requires lectures to be recorded (by student)
- Hearing impaired student (student will need to make arrangements through Saskatchewan Deaf & Hard of Hearing Association for either computerized notetaker services or a sign language interpreter)

Learning Disability

This is determined through a psycho-educational assessment by a registered psychologist completed within the last five years. If assessment is older than five years or if the student believes they have a learning disability, they should contact LDAS Learning Disabilities Association of Saskatchewan 652-4116.

Canada/Saskatchewan Study Grant

If the student has a permanent disability and is eligible for a Student Loan, they may be eligible for the Canada/ Saskatchewan Study Grant. A permanent disability is **‘a functional limitation caused by a physical or mental impairment that restricts the ability of the student to perform the daily activities necessary to participate fully in studies at the post-secondary level.’** The impairment must be expected to remain with the student for their natural life.

Medical documentation must support the application for funds for a tutors, technical aids or attendants. The medical documentation is a separate typewritten letter on the doctor’s letterhead, addressed to the student, stating: the diagnosis, date of diagnosis, and listing each of the aids required for the student to ‘achieve academic success.’ The student can reuse the letter for each student loan or Study Grant application.
