THE HONOURABLE ROY ROMANOW



Roy Romanow was elected chancellor effective November 1, 2016 for a three-year term. His appointment was confirmed at a meeting of University Senate on October 15, 2016 based on the recommendation of a joint nomination committee

The Honourable Roy Romanow, P.C., O.C., S.O.M., Q.C., served in public office in Canada for more than 30 years.

Chancellor Romanow's provincial political career began in 1967 when he was first elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature. From 1971 to 1982 he served as Deputy Premier and Attorney General of Saskatchewan. He played a key role in the federal-provincial negotiations that resulted in the *Constitution Act 1982*, which includes the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*. During this time, he also led the reorganization of Saskatchewan's court system, the creation of the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission, and the introduction of a modern Legal Aid system.

In 1987, Chancellor Romanow became the Leader of the Opposition in Saskatchewan and served in this role until 1991. He then served as premier from 1991 to 2001. During this period, major health reforms were introduced based on programs of well-being, which balanced the delivery of health care more appropriately between acute care and preventative programs. A significant achievement of the Romanow government was turning Saskatchewan's large fiscal deficits into balanced budgets.

After his tenure as premier, Chancellor Romanow was appointed by then Prime Minister Jean Chrétien in 2001 to head the Royal Commission on the Future of Health Care in Canada, which resulted in a final report entitled *Building on Values*.

Chancellor Romanow, an officer of the Order of Canada and recipient of the Saskatchewan Order of Merit, has also received the Pan. American Health Organization's 2003 Administration Award for his work with the Health Commission and his commitment to human rights and justice initiatives. In 2004, he became a member of the federal Privy Council through a five-year appointment to Canada's Security Intelligence Review Committee. From 2008 to 2013. Chancellor Romanow was the Advisory Board Co-Chair and Spokesperson for the Canadian Index of Wellbeing. He currently serves as a member of the Elections Canada Advisory Board, and as the co-chair of the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness

Currently, Chancellor Romanow is a senior fellow in public policy in the Department of Political Studies at the University of Saskatchewan. He received both his B.A., 1960, and LLB., 1964, from the U of S. He is recognized as one of the 100 Alumni of Influence and is the recipient of numerous honorary degrees from Canadian universities.



The convocation ceremony is a calling together of the new graduates of the University of Saskatchewan, symbolizing the historical practice of calling together all former graduates. In current times, the major functions of convocation

are the election of representatives to university governing bodies and the admission of candidates to degrees. The chancellor, appointed by senate as the chair of convocation, is the highest official and spokesperson of the university.

The convocation ceremony marks the transition from the role of student to the holder of a degree with its accompanying rights and privileges.

The ceremony, solemnized in the presence of the university community and family and friends of the graduands, consists of three parts: a procession marking the leaving of the old status and entering the new; the president's statement to the graduands, the secretary's petition and the chancellor's consent for their admission; followed by individual presentation by a university orator and admission by the chancellor to the degrees to which they are entitled.

As graduates are admitted to their degrees, a graduation hood, which has a colour symbolizing a particular degree, is placed over each graduate's head.

ENTRANCE

Graduands in their academic dress march in procession into the ceremony in the following order: graduands in the order in which their degrees are to be conferred; faculty; board of governors; senate; guests of honour; the president; the chancellor; the lieutenant governor. When the members of convocation reach their places they remain standing during the Vice-Regal Salute, the singing of "O Canada" and the invocation.

ORDER OF THE CEREMONY

The first business is the conferring of honorary degrees, followed by the convocation address, president's statement to the graduands, conferring of degrees and presentation of awards. The meeting is closed by the chancellor rising and leading the procession in the reverse order out of the hall.

THE PETITION

The university secretary on behalf of all the candidates, addresses the chancellor and senate in the following words:

"Eminent Chancellor, Mr. President, members of the University Senate and Board, I present to you the petition of the Council of this University that the candidates to be named, having fulfilled all the requirements of the bylaws, may, with your permission, be admitted to the degrees and certificates to which they are entitled".









THE ADMISSION

The chancellor then addresses the candidates:

"By virtue of the authority vested in me by the legislature of this province, and with the consent of the council of this university, I consent to admit you to the degrees and certificates to which you are entitled and to invest you with all the powers, rights and privileges pertaining thereto."

THE PRESENTATION

The university orator approaches the chancellor from the left and presents the candidates:

"Eminent Chancellor, on behalf of the faculty of ______, I present to you these scholars and ask that you will confer on them the degree of ______."

Each candidate then comes forward and the degree hood is placed on his or her shoulders. As the orator speaks the candidate's name in full, the candidate moves forward in front of the chancellor. Then the chancellor says, "I admit you". Hereupon the candidate passes to the chancellor's right, is greeted by the dean of the faculty, or designate, and receives the degree parchment.

DEGREES IN ABSENTIA

In such cases, the university secretary says:

"Eminent Chancellor, in the name of the faculties, I ask you to grant the degrees and certificates, in absentia, to those students who have met the requirements to graduate, but were not able to be present today."

ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress lends an element of colourful pageantry to the convocation proceedings. This traditional clothing—worn on a daily basis at universities in earlier times—is now reserved for ceremonial functions.

At the University of Saskatchewan, the following academic dress is adopted for all appropriate occasions: The gown resembles a long cape with full sleeve cut to elbow and terminating in a point for the bachelor's degree; with long sleeve and a semi-circular cut at the bottom for the master's degree; and with round open sleeves for the doctor's degree. The material is black broadcloth for the bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees. The doctoral gown incorporates green and gold on the front and sleeve panels.

The hoods for the bachelor's and master's degrees are of black broadcloth. The master's and doctor's hoods have a lining and the bachelor's an edging (and in some cases, a lining) of a color distinctive of the character of the degree.

Ph.D. hoods have a green satin lining with gold trim and the honorary degree hoods feature a white satin trim. A velvet Beefeater style hat with a green, gold and white tassel is also part of the doctoral dress.

Dave has been on campus for 20 years, and is the Student Central coordinator in the Vice-Provost Teaching and Learning portfolio.




At the U of S, we have one of the highest populations of Aboriginal students among Canadian post-secondary institutions. As indicated in our Third Integrated Plan, one of our most influential documents, it is important to us to

include Indigenous knowledge and experience into our daily practices, curriculum and celebrations. At convocation, one of our most important celebrations, we display the Treaty No. 6 flag, Métis flag and sing an honour song.

HONOUR SONG

These are special songs to demonstrate respect for an individual or group in recognition of their accomplishments such as a return from military service or other events. In some families, individuals have their own song, which is sung for them when they are being honoured.





MÉTIS FLAG

The Métis flag has been a symbol for the Métis Nation since as early as 1816. The infinity symbol represents the joining of two cultures—forever intertwined, a people forever. The flag is nationally recognized by the Métis Nation across Canada.





GRADUATION POWWOW

The University of Saskatchewan Powwow celebrates the academic achievements of graduating Métis, First Nations and Inuit students from the U of S and Saskatchewan high schools.

Powwows have been hosted on the Saskatoon campus for almost 30 years. Since 2009, the powwow has been held in the spring to celebrate graduating students.

AL WINIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN

Dr. Gregg Adams (DVM'82) Dr. Gregg Adams, U of S professor of veterinary biomedical sciences since 1991, has worked with colleagues across campus to develop an innovative reproductive research program. Gregg's team recently celebrated the birth of the world's first bison babies from in vitro fertilization and frozen embryos, paving the way for species recovery. Among his numerous awards is the U of S Distinguished Researcher Award.

Max FineDay (BA'15)

Max FineDay is the co-executive director of Canadian Roots Exchange, a national charity that brings together Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth to explore reconciliation through exchange programs, national conferences and leadership development. He co-developed Next Up: First Nations and Métis Youth in Action in 2014, a Saskatchewan-wide program focused on supporting emerging Indigenous youth leaders through skills and issues-based training.





Jo-Ann Hnatiuk (BSN'95) In 2003, Jo-Ann Hnatiuk was deployed to Afghanistan as a critical care nursing officer for the Canadian Forces. She served in the intensive care unit and emergency room, and provided clinical education on-air transport and pediatrics. In 2007, Jo-Ann was redeployed as an air medevac nurse with the Task Force Afghanistan Corsair Medevac Unit in an effort to augment the U.S. Blackhawks' medevac.

Dr. David Mulder (MD'62) Myron Stadnyk was appointed President and CEO of ARC's Resources in 1997 and has helped the company grow from a \$200 million start-up to an eight billion dollar company. ARC's production has grown to become one of Canada's top 10 energy producers, employing over 500 employees and, at times, over 1,000 contractors.

Jeff Norris (BA'97) Jeff Norris's career in non-profit organizations began in the '90s when he led The Big Bike Ride for the Heart and Stroke Foundation. Jeff, currently president and CEO of Royal Columbian Hospital Foundation in New Westminster B.C, received the Giving Hearts Award by the Association of Fundraising Professionals (Vancouver chapter) and a Forty under 40 Award by Business in Vancouver.

Ralph Young (BE'67)
For 43 years, 16 as president and CEO, Ralph Young was integral to the success of Melcor Developments Ltd., a real estate development company based in Edmonton. Ralph's work has been recognized with several awards, including the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal, Alberta Centennial Medal, and the City of Edmonton Salute to Excellence. He served as the chancellor of the University of Alberta from 2012-2016.


Improving life for kidney patients

The pioneering work of U of S clinician researcher Dr. Marc Baltzan—who performed the third kidney transplant in Canada in 1963—put Saskatoon's University Hospital on the map among world leaders in transplant surgeries and led to the creation of the Saskatchewan Transplant Program in 1989.



Building a better beer

Professor Emeritus Bryan Harvey (BSA'60, MSA'61) was an early pioneer in the area of barley breeding. Harvey and his research partner, Brian Rossnagel, created more than 50 types of barley, including the well known Harrington, which has been a dominant variety in Canada for more than 20 years.



Concrete contribution

U of S professor Thorbergur
Thorvaldson and his team
developed a formula for sulphateresistant cement that made
concrete more durable and led
to a world-wide change in the
manufacture of commercial
concrete. In 1966, the Chemistry
Building on campus was renamed
the Thorvaldson Building in his
honour.



Canola development

U of S researchers contributed to the development of canola, a bright yellow flowering oilseed crop that generates about \$26.7 billion in economic benefits to Canada annually, with 250,000 people working in careers related to the industry. The name "canola" was chosen to represent "Can" for Canada and "ola" for oil. Canola is the world's only 'made-in-Canada' crop.










A legacy of nuclear medicine excellence

U of S medical physicists Harold Johns and Sylvia Fedoruk developed the cobalt-60 unit in 1951, setting a new global standard for cancer treatment and paving the way for the U of S to become a leader in areas of nuclear medicine, biomedical imaging and related research.



Leading the world in lentils

U of S scientists have been key to Canada's success in pulse crops, and a great measure of credit goes to U of S Professor Emeritus Al Slinkard, whose crop breeding research has helped make Canada the global leader in lentil exports, and put Saskatchewan at the heart of the country's pulse industry.

DR. ALI RAJPUT



Dr. Ali Rajput is a distiguished professor emeritus and pioneer in in the field of Parkinson's research, whose discoveries over the last five decades have made him a worldleading authority on the disease.

Dr. Rajput grew up in Pakistan. After graduating top of his class in medicine at the University of Sind in Pakistan, Dr. Rajput did his residency and obtained his master's in neurology at the University of Michigan, before moving on to graduate work at Queen's University.

After joining the University of Saskatchewan in 1967 as a faculty member in the College of Medicine, Dr. Rajput established the Saskatchewan Movement Disorders Program—now widely known as the best program of this type in the world—and played major role in founding the annual Telemiracle Saskatchewan telethon.

As head of neurology at Royal University Hospital from 1985 to 2001, Rajput led many major developments in Parkinson's research and treatment and the science of neurology.

He founded Saskatchewan Parkinson's Disease Foundation, Movement Disorder Group of Canada and served on several national and international committees, including Parkinson's Disease Working Group of the World Health Organization.

Throughout his career, Dr. Rajput has received many major awards, including the Morton Schulman Award from the Parkinson Society Canada, Spirit of the Royal University Hospital Award, Saskatchewan Order of Merit, Officer of

the Order of Canada, and U of S Distinguished Researcher Award.

In 2005 his work was chosen by the Saskatchewan Medical Association (SMA) as one of the four most significant advances in Medicine in the 100-year history of this Province. In 2006 he was named Physician of the Year by the SMA and CTV Saskatoon's Citizen of the Year.

Dr. Rajput has published extensively and has been on editorial boards of several journals. Received Prime of Life Achievement Award for work after retirement. He is currently Distinguished Professor of Neurology, and maintains active clinical practice and research.

Rajput, who spent a year on sabbatical at the prestigious Mayo Clinic in 1980-81, is also an accomplished author with more than 200 scientific papers, articles and book chapters to his credit. He maintains active clinical practice and research, and has received a Prime of Life Achievement award for work after retirement.

HAROLD CHAPMAN



Harold Chapman has spent a lifetime committed to the co-operative movement as a builder and educator in the province.

Born in Saskatoon in 1917, Chapman grew up

on a farm and studied agriculture and cooperatives at the University of Saskatchewan. He graduated with a B.Sc. in Agriculture in 1943.

In 1945, he was hired by the province to help develop farming, fishing, trapping and housing co-operatives. Among his early achievements was establishing co-op farms for Canadian veterans returning from the Second World War.

Named the first director of the Co-operative Institute in Saskatoon in 1955, Chapman spent the next two decades as an educator. While in this role, he helped organize the Saskatoon Community Clinic in 1962 and was a founding member of the international organization, Association of Co-operative Educators, in 1965.

In 1973 Mr. Chapman joined Federated Co-operatives Ltd. as member and public relations director.

Since retiring in 1982, he has remained involved with community organizations and with the co-operative movement, including the Centre for the Study of Co-operatives, located at the U of S. The centre helped sponsor and co-publish his 2012 memoir *Sharing my Life: Building the Co-operative Movement*, his account of the history and legacy of co-operatives in Saskatchewan.

Mr Chapman celebrated his 100th birthday this year by being inducted into the Order of Canada.

ANDREW GROSVENOR



The New Researcher Award is presented annually to an outstanding new scholar in recognition of their significant contributions to knowledge or artistic creativity. Andrew Grosvenor, associate professor in the Department of Chemistry, is the fall 2017 recipient of this esteemed award.

Dr. Grosvenor completed his B.Sc. (Honours) in Chemistry (2003), M.Sc. (2005) from the University of Western Ontario, and Ph.D. from the University of Alberta (2008). After

completing an NSERC Postdoctoral Fellowship at McMaster University, Dr. Grosvenor joined the U of S Department of Chemistry in 2009. Since coming to the U of S, Dr. Grosvenor has become a world leading expert in the field of solid-state chemistry.

In his research, Dr. Grosvenor uses X-ray spectroscopy and the synchrotron facilities located at the U of S's Canadian Light Source to answer critical questions relevant to the energy and mineral sectors. Using X-ray photoelectron and absorption spectroscopies to characterize inorganic solids, his work has applications to areas such as the examination of the materials used to sequester radioactive nuclear waste, the environmental management practices of tailings in mine sites, and the development of strategies to mitigate concrete and rebar corrosion in potash mines. Just eight years after coming to the U of S. Dr. Grosvenor has become one of Canada's most prominent experts in the characterization of materials using X-ray spectroscopy.

Dr. Grosvenor's scholarly output to date is

truly impressive. He has published 68 refereed journal articles in some of the best journals in his field and has been cited over 3,200 times. He has also delivered 32 invited presentations in Canada and around the world and given more than 50 other contributed conference presentations. His funding record includes operational grants, industrial grants, and infrastructure grants from leading national agencies, including a \$1.4M X-ray Photoelectron Spectrometer that will enable the university to significantly expand its research in materials science.

In addition to these accomplishments, Dr. Grosvenor has built a world class research group, taken an active leadership role at the Canadian Light Source, and proven himself to be an outstanding supervisor to his trainees, who themselves are making outstanding contributions to the fields of inorganic and physical chemistry. In 2014, Dr. Grosvenor was recognized by his peers as just one of 13 Emerging Investigators (and the only Canadian) in solid-state materials chemistry by the American Chemical Society.

DR. CHELSEA WILLNESS



Dr. Chelsea Willness is Associate Dean,
Research & Academic at the Edwards School
of Business and Associate Professor in the
Department of Human Resources and
Organizational Behaviour. She received her
PhD in Industrial-Organizational Psychology
from the University of Calgary in 2008.

Dr. Willness is a passionate champion of community-engaged scholarship and teaching and has mastered the art of creating authentic learning communities. Dr. Willness creates a vibrant learning environment by developing community-engaged learning experiences in each course she teaches. Class

meetings serve as professional workshops rather than lectures, and assignments and course projects become real-time case studies where students apply their learnings in live client settings. Consequently, students describe her courses as "amazing," "unforgettable experiences." Dr. Willness is the embodiment of positive teaching. She describes her teaching philosophy as developing "whole citizens" by focusing on not only disciplinary knowledge, but also broader transferable skills, self-efficacy, and citizenship. Students say they would "relive" her course experiences because of their life-changing impact. Most recently, Dr. Willness launched an innovative experiential course that pairs business students with nonprofit boards and community mentors for an 8-month governance practicum. She has a keen interest in governance and leadership development toward capacity building and organizational sustainability, and she is actively involved in governance initiatives in the not-for-profit sector.

Dr. Willness has received University, college, and international teaching awards, including the USSU Teaching Excellence Award (2016), University of Saskatchewan's Award for Distinction in Community-Engaged Teaching & Scholarship (2014), and the Provost's College Award for Outstanding Teaching (2014). At the 2012 Academy of Management conference in Boston, she was awarded an Innovation in Teaching Award for her design and implementation of HR courses that integrate community-based experiential learning.

Dr. Willness has held two national research grants (from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada) for her research on how stakeholders respond to organizations' environmental practices and community involvement. Notably, she also has published papers on experiential learning and has shared her knowledge of community-engaged learning across the University of Saskatchewan campus, as well as nationally and internationally at numerous post-secondary education conferences.

Dr. Willness's greatest impact is on her students. As one explained: "I was completely altered by the {community engagement] project. I believe every major should get an opportunity like this. Seeing the real world application of your major and getting to participate and see the difference you can make is a really great experience."

MARGRET ASMUSS



During her 13 years on campus, Margret Asmuss has become known as the go-to person for sustainability at the University of Saskatchewan.

Margret joined the U of S in 2004 as a sustainability co-ordinator with the Facilities

Management Division. From there, she was instrumental in growing the Office of Sustainability on campus. She also played a large role in developing the Campus Sustainability Plan, which provides a framework for integrating sustainability into the university's activities.

Currently, she oversees the day-to-day activities of the Office of Sustainability and progress on Campus Sustainability Plan goals and initiatives. She also facilitates the implementation of the Campus Sustainability Plan's Education and Research initiatives. In this regard, her focus is to facilitate linkages to sustainability in those disciplines outside the traditional environmental and sustainability disciplines.

She also plays a part in the Sustainability Living Lab, which provides students with sustainability-focused challenges for project-based courses and facilitating professional development opportunities for faculty and instructors who wish to integrate sustainability into their teaching.

Asmuss is a proud alumna, having completed both her B.A.in English and Master of Continuing Education degrees at the University of Saskatchewan.

Prior to starting her career with her alma mater, she worked in the area of sustainability as a consultant and within the non-governmental organization sector.

Her combination of knowledge, expertise and readiness helps others achieve their sustainability goals, resulting in a constant stream of collaborative projects and positive relationships.

DR. CAREY SIMONSON



Carey Simonson is a professor and graduate chair in the Department of Mechanical Engineering at the University of Saskatchewan. He received his bachelor's degree in 1991, master's degree in 1993 and PhD degree in 1998—all in Mechanical Engineering—from the U of S. He has been a professor at the U of S since 2001.

Dr. Simonson has supervised 50 graduate and postdoctoral students—30 MSc, 13 PhD, seven PDF—who have published over 100 refereed journal papers and 50 conference papers, and have been awarded over \$1 million in prestigious scholarships and awards.

During sabbatical leaves in 2007/2008 and 2014/2015, Dr. Simonson was a visiting professor at the University of Oulu in Finland. Prior to becoming a faculty member at the U of S, he spent four years as a researcher at the Technical Research Centre of Finland.

Prof. Simonson is a fellow of the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE), the premier society in his research field with over 56,000 members from more than 130 countries. Less than 1% of ASHRAE members (479) are Fellows. He is an associate editor of

the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) Journal *Thermal Science and Engineering Applications* and an editorial board member of the international journal *Energy and Buildings*.

In February 2015, Prof. Simonson received the NSERC Synergy Award for Innovation—the third NSERC Synergy Award for the U of S in the 17-year history of the award. The nomination was titled "Venmar and University of Saskatchewan – Research and Development of a New, Revolutionary HVAC system". In April 2017, Prof. Simonson received the U of S Graduate Students' Association Teaching Excellence Award.

At home, Carey and his wife (Virpi) are proud parents of 10 children (8 boys and 2 girls). The oldest received his Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from the U of S in June 2017 and the youngest started kindergarten in September 2017.

CAROL HENRY



The J.W. George Ivany Award for Internationalization recognizes the exceptional contributions of a faculty member or administrator toward the internationalization objectives of the university. The award was named after Dr. J.W. George Ivany during whose presidency the University formalized its

commitment to internationalization.

The 2017 award recipient is Dr. Carol Henry, associate professor and assistant dean, Division of Nutrition and Dietetics, College of Pharmacy and Nutrition. Dr. Henry is an internationally recognized scholar-practitioner in community-engaged research, international development, and teaching and learning. She leads a multi-partner, multi-discipline program addressing the determinants of and solutions to food security and malnutrition through understanding the complex nature of food systems, food product development technology, and nutrition interventions.

Dr. Henry's contributions to the internationalization of teaching and learning have had significant impacts on our university. Her activities have increased

international learning experiences for University of Saskatchewan students through graduate and undergraduate study abroad and student exchange programs in Uganda, Ethiopia, and the Caribbean. Dr. Henry has engaged multiple University of Saskatchewan colleges in these initiatives and promoted global citizenship and crosscultural content and competency whereby internationalizing the College of Nutrition and Pharmacy curricula. Dr. Henry has enhanced the reputation of our university in Africa and the Caribbean in teaching, training, and capacity building, and has developed strong partnerships to recruit international graduate students to the University of Saskatchewan.

It is with extreme pleasure that we present the 2017 J.W. George Ivany Award for Internationalization to Dr. Carol Henry.

DR. MAUREEN REED



The Distinguished Researcher Award recognizes a faculty member's contributions to scholarship through the creation, expansion, and critique of knowledge. Maureen Reed, professor and assistant director of the School of Environment and Sustainability (SENS), is the fall 2017 recipient of this prestigious award.

Dr. Reed has pioneered work on gender and forestry in the global north by incorporating feminist theory and gender-based analyses into studies of environmental governance in Canada. Her award-winning 2003 book, *Taking Stands: Gender and Sustainability of*

Rural Communities, helped us understand the contributions of, and contradictions facing, women living in forestry communities during a time of economic and regulatory restructuring of BC's forestry sector. She is now investigating how gender and culture affect the capacity of rural and Indigenous communities in Saskatchewan to respond to climate hazards.

Dr. Reed is internationally recognized for her work on the social dimensions of sustainability and multi-level environmental governance. Her "PROGRESS" lab was designed to better understand PRactices Of Governance for Environmental and Social Sustainability which has focused attention on community-based models such as UNESCO biosphere reserves, community forests, and model forest organizations. The author of seven books or monographs, 35 book chapters, and 67 peer reviewed papers, Dr. Reed has made exceptional contributions to understanding how we govern ourselves to advance sustainability.

Dr. Reed has twice been recognized by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council for her work with UNESCO Biosphere Reserves in Canada. In 2010, Dr. Reed was invited by the Canadian Commission for UNESCO to serve on the Canadian Man and Biosphere Committee and is now its co-chair. In 2016, she was the executive producer of an eight-part documentary TV series, *Striking Balance*, which aired in Ontario and British Columbia. This series highlights the work being done by biosphere reserve organizations that serve as model regions for Canada and internationally. She currently is working with biosphere reserve organizations and Indigenous communities to demonstrate how sustainability and reconciliation can be mutually fostered.

Dr. Reed was also instrumental in the establishment of the research-intensive, interdisciplinary School of Environment and Sustainability, bringing together the school's founding faculty and developing its graduate programs. A dedicated teacher and mentor, Dr. Reed won the 2015 university's Distinguished Graduate Supervisor Award, as well as other honours, including the 2016 Lifetime Achievement Award from the YWCA-Saskatoon.

ROBERT PATRICK EMES

Robert was born in Calgary and spent his developmental years in Calgary and Vancouver. Since 2007, he has called Saskatoon his home. Prior to studying at the University of Saskatchewan, he completed an apprenticeship in carpentry and worked as a carpenter in the construction industry.

He began his undergraduate program in the College of Arts and Science in January 2015.

Today he has realized his goal of graduating with a Bachelor of Arts Three-year Degree with a major in Economics and has achieved

the academic recognition of graduating with Great Distinction. Robert is the recipient of the President's Medal, which is awarded to the undergraduate student who is graduating with the highest average from the University of Saskatchewan.

In the 2015-2016 academic year, Robert's academic achievements were rewarded with a University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Scholarship and recognition on the Dean's List for the College of Arts and Science.

Rob is an outdoor enthusiast whose hobbies include cycling, hiking, camping, canoeing and kayaking. He is also a member of the Saskatoon Canoe and Kayak Club and is the student editor of the Saskatchewan Law Review.
