BLAINE FAVEL



Mr. Favel, currently the CEO of One Earth Oil and Gas, is an influential Plains Cree leader who has made significant contributions to scholarship, education, public service and the Canadian public good.

During his tenure as Chief of the Poundmaker Cree Nation in Cutknife, SK, Chief Favel established the first community-based justice program for First Nations with the introduction of sentencing circles on reserves. A former

Grand Chief of the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations, Mr. Favel pioneered two national firsts; the establishment of the First Nations Bank of Canada, Canada's only Aboriginal controlled bank, and the Saskatchewan Indian Gaming Authority, Canada's first Indian gaming organization. He implemented the 1996 Treaty Implementation Process under the supervision of the Office of the Treaty Commissioner with the governments of Canada and Saskatchewan. Chief Favel initiated the 1996 demographic study entitled *Saskatchewan and Aboriginal Peoples in the 21st Century: Social Economic and Political Changes and Challenges*—a study that has been accepted as a reference document for the business community and government in designing education, employment, and Aboriginal business strategies.

Mr. Favel was appointed to an ambassadorial level posting by Prime Minister Chretien as Canadian Counsellor on International Indigenous Issues. This office advised Cabinet and the Foreign Affairs and International Trade Minister on human rights and trade issues affecting

indigenous peoples globally. Mr. Favel has also worked as legal counsel with the law firm of Bennett Jones and as an investment banker with RBC Capital Markets energy group. He was a senior personal advisor to two Assembly of First Nations National Chiefs, National Chiefs Ovide Mercredi and Phil Fontaine.

In the not-for-profit sector, Mr. Favel served as a board member of the Calgary United Way and was a member of the Calgary Committee to End Homelessness prior to serving on the board of the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness, a national organization launched to introduce the Housing First program to Canadian cities. Mr. Favel has served on the boards for the Southern Alberta Institute of Technology and the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission.

Mr. Favel received his bachelor of education degree from the Indian Teacher Education Program at the University of Saskatchewan, his law degree at Queen's University and a master's of business administration degree from Harvard Business School. Mr. Favel resides in Calgary, Alberta, and is a proud father to five children.



Our ceremony

The convocation ceremony is a calling together of the new graduates of the University of Saskatchewan, symbolizing the historical practice of calling together all former graduates. In current times, the major functions of convocation are the election of representatives to university governing bodies and the admission of candidates to degrees. The chancellor, appointed by senate as the chair of convocation, is the highest official and spokesperson of the university.

The convocation ceremony marks the transition from the role of student to the holder of a degree with its accompanying rights and privileges.

The ceremony, solemnized in the presence of the university community and family and friends of the graduands, consists of three parts: a procession marking the leaving of the old status and entering the new; the president's statement to the graduands, the secretary's petition and the chancellor's consent for their admission; followed by individual presentation by a university orator and admission by the chancellor to the degrees to which they are entitled.

As graduates are admitted to their degrees, a graduation hood, which has a colour symbolizing a particular degree, is placed over each graduate's head.

ENTRANCE

Graduands in their academic dress march in procession into the ceremony in the following order: graduands in the order in which their degrees are to be conferred; faculty; board of governors; senate; guests of honour; the president; the chancellor; the lieutenant governor. When the members of convocation reach their places they remain standing during the Vice-Regal Salute, the singing of "O Canada" and the invocation.

ORDER OF THE CEREMONY

The first business is the conferring of honorary degrees, followed by convocation address, president's statement to the graduands, the conferring of degrees and the presentation of awards. The meeting is closed by the chancellor rising and leading the procession in the reverse order out of the hall.



The Petition

The university secretary on behalf of all the candidates, addresses the chancellor and senate in the following words: *“Eminent Chancellor, Madame President, members of the University Senate and Board, I present to you the petition of the Council of this University that the candidates to be named, having fulfilled all the requirements of the bylaws, may, with your permission, be admitted to the degrees and certificates to which they are entitled.”*

The Admission

The chancellor then addresses the candidates in these words:

“By virtue of the authority vested in me by the legislature of this province, and with the consent

of the council of this university, I consent to admit you to the degrees and certificates to which you are entitled and to invest you with all the powers, rights and privileges pertaining thereto.”

The Presentation

The university orator approaches the chancellor from the left and presents the candidates with these words:

“Eminent Chancellor, on behalf of the faculty of _____, I present to you these scholars and ask that you will confer on them the degree of _____.”

Each candidate then comes forward and the degree hood is placed on his or her shoulders.

As the orator speaks the candidate's name in full, the candidate moves forward in front of the chancellor. Then the chancellor says, *“I admit you”*. Hereupon the candidate passes to the chancellor's right, is greeted by the dean of the faculty, or designate, and receives the degree parchment.

DEGREES IN ABSENTIA

In such cases, the university secretary says:

“Eminent Chancellor, in the name of the faculties, I ask you to grant the degrees and certificates, in absentia, to those students who have met the requirements to graduate, but were not able to be present today.”

At the U of S, we have one of the highest populations of Aboriginal students among Canadian post-secondary institutions. As indicated in our Third Integrated Plan, one of our most influential documents, it is important to us to include Indigenous knowledge and experience in our daily practices, curriculum and celebrations. At convocation, one of our most important celebrations, we display the Treaty No. 6 flag, sing an honour song and take part in a smudging ceremony.

Treaty flag

Represented on the Treaty No. 6 flag are the signatories of the treaty—the First Nations and the Queen's representative. The signatories stand in front of a Treaty medal with the Union Jack in the background. First Nations Veterans adopted this flag and often bring it to powwows to show respect and to remind the younger generations that treaties were signed under this flag.

Honour song

These are special songs to demonstrate respect for an individual or group in recognition of their accomplishments such as

a return from military service or other events. In some families, individuals have their own song, which is sung for them when they are being honoured.

Smudging ceremony and blessing

Smudging is a protocol observed and performed by many First Nations. Smudging is conducted at First Nation gatherings such as meetings, ceremonies and for personal prayer. First Nations generally used sweet grass, sage, cedars and other plants for smudging. In Saskatchewan, sweet grass is the primary plant used for smudging. To smudge is an act of preparation for the mind and physical surroundings.

THE CONVOCATION CEREMONY

ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress lends an element of colourful pageantry to the convocation proceedings. This traditional clothing—worn on a daily basis at universities in earlier times—is now more commonly reserved for ceremonial functions.

At the University of Saskatchewan, the following academic dress is adopted to be worn upon all appropriate occasions: The gown resembles a long cape with full sleeve cut to elbow and terminating in a point for the bachelor's degree; with long sleeve and a semi-circular cut at the bottom for the master's degree; and with round open sleeves for the doctor's degree. The material is black broadcloth for the bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees. The doctoral gown incorporates green and gold on the front and sleeve panels.

The hoods for the bachelor's and master's degrees are of black broadcloth. The master's and doctor's hoods have a lining and the bachelor's an edging (and in some cases, a lining) of a color distinctive of the character of the degree.

Ph.D. hoods have a green satin lining with gold trim and the honorary degree hoods feature a white satin trim. A velvet Beefeater style hat with a green, gold and white tassel is also part of the doctoral dress.

Chancellor – a black wool robe with gold braid lines on the front facings and outlines the collar, as well as the hem of the gown. The sleeves are of green velvet, also edged in gold braid, and lined in green taffeta, with a gold braid epaulet on each shoulder. The black velvet befeater has a gold bullion cord and tassel. The chancellor's stole is of green velvet with a beaded Plains Cree Medicine Wheel symbolizing the sacredness of life and the interconnectedness of the universe.

Vice-Chancellor (President) – same design as the chancellor's gown and trencher. The vice-chancellor's gown is green with silver braid on the facing instead of gold and a black silk velvet trencher with silver button and tassel.

Volunteer orators step up to the microphone

Thirteen orators have been selected through an audition process to read out the names of degree recipients as they receive their parchments. The recruits hail from all parts of campus and perform a wide range of roles throughout the U of S, but all are gifted with resonant voices, fine pronunciation skills and share a great attention to detail.

The post of university orator can be traced back hundreds of years to universities in the United Kingdom such as Oxford and Cambridge. Traditionally orators served as the official voice of the university, composing letters, giving speeches in Latin at ceremonial occasions and presenting candidates for honorary degrees.

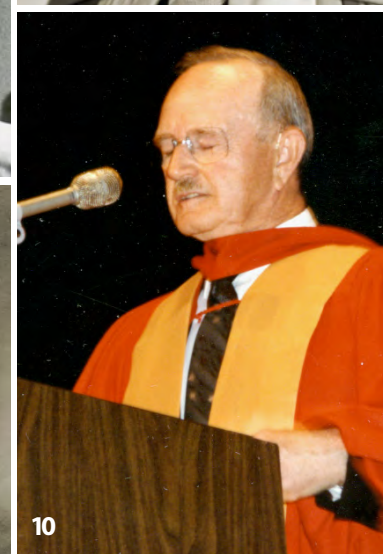
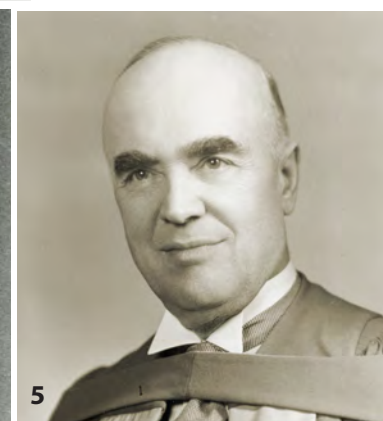
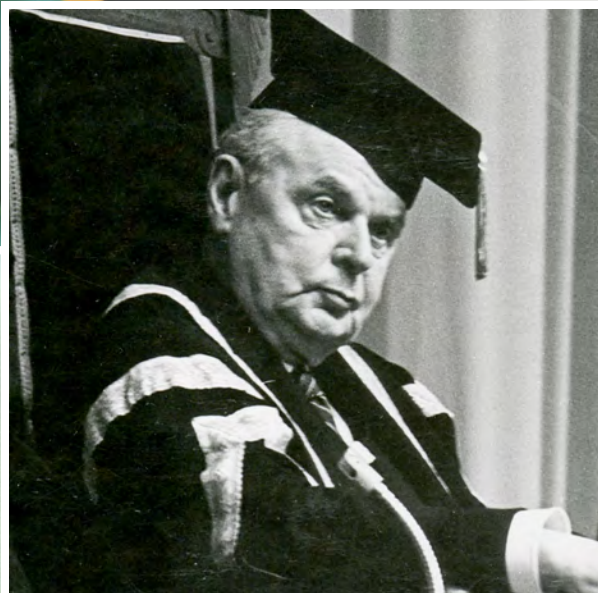

Canadian soprano Edith Wiens' beautiful, versatile voice and assured musicality embrace an astonishingly vast repertoire from the baroque to the contemporary. She has collaborated with the world's foremost conductors and orchestras, including the New York, Berlin, London, Munich and Israel Philharmonic Orchestras; Boston, Chicago, Toronto, Montreal and San Francisco Symphonies, the London Philharmonia, Dresden Staatskapelle and Cleveland Orchestras, the Academy of St Martin-in-the-Fields, Orchestre

National de France and Orchestre de Paris; under such conductors as Daniel Barenboim, Sir Colin Davis, Charles Dutoit, Bernard Haitink, Sir Neville Marriner, Kurt Masur, Seiji Ozawa, Wolfgang Sawallisch, and Sir Georg Solti.

Ms. Wiens has been welcomed at the Salzburg, Lucerne, Tanglewood, Dresden, Berlin and Vienna Festivals, and the London Proms. Renowned as a lieder singer of the highest order, Ms. Wiens has given recitals in London (Wigmore Hall), Paris, Toronto, New York, Moscow, Amsterdam's Concertgebouw, Buenos Aires, Frankfurt, Florence, Munich and Berlin, and has been repeatedly invited to Vienna's Musikverein. Her operatic appearances included principal Mozart roles at Glyndebourne, La Scala, the Santa Fe Opera, Amsterdam Opera, Tokyo, and Buenos Aires' Teatro Colon.

A recipient of both the Grammy and Diapason d'Or Awards, Ms. Wiens' discography includes works of Bach, Mozart, Haydn, Grieg, Mendelssohn, Mahler, Zemlinsky, Schumann and Wagner and four acclaimed CDs of Lieder by Schubert, Schumann, Brahms and Strauss, and Zemlinsky's Lyrical Symphony with the Orchestre de la Suisse Romande.

Ms. Wiens was born in Saskatoon and has extended family living in Saskatchewan. When she sang a recital in Saskatoon some years ago there was a celebratory feeling to the event as she was sharing her gifts in her first home.

Ms. Wiens is an Officer of the Order of Canada and has received several honorary degrees. She is a jury member of international competitions such as ARD Munich, Bertelsmann Neue Stimmen, Montreal and Geneva. She has held master classes in Europe and North America, including the Royal College of Music and the Guildhall School in London, the Young Ensembles of the Munich, Frankfurt and Dresden opera houses, in Salzburg and Vienna, at Ravinia, and at the University of Saskatchewan. Ms. Wiens is also the artistic director of the Internationale Meistersinger Akademie. She joined the Vocal Arts faculty of The Juilliard School three years ago.

Ms. Wiens lives in New York and Munich with her cellist husband Kai Moser. Their sons are acclaimed musicians Johannes Moser (cello) and Benjamin Moser (piano).

ANNE DOIG



Dr. Anne Doig received her MD from the University of Saskatchewan in 1976, and in 1978 began serving patients of City Centre Family Physicians in Saskatoon.

As a clinical associate professor in Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at the U of S, Dr. Doig has been passing her knowledge on to students. She has been twice honoured for her commitment to teaching and students, receiving the Clinical Teacher of the Year in Family

Medicine award in 1990 from Saskatoon City Hospital and the Excellence in Teaching Award in 1996 from the Association of Professors of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

Dr. Doig has served Saskatchewan and her profession through her work with the Saskatchewan Medical Association and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan. Nationally she has worked with the Canadian Medical Association (CMA), serving as president and past president. During her tenure with the CMA, Dr. Doig played a vital role in launching the association's vision of transforming the Canadian health-care system. Currently Dr. Doig is an unaffiliated Director on the Board of Canada Health Infoway, which oversees federal and provincial/territorial investment in health IT systems.

Dr. Doig is on the Board of Directors of STARS (Shock Trauma Air Rescue Society) and the Advisory Board of MEND SK, a program dedicated to preventing childhood obesity. She was medical advisor to the Saskatchewan Cancer Agency's population health division, and is an original contributor to the Advances in Labour

and Risk Management (ALARM) program of the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Canada.

In 2010, the Women's Executive Network recognized Dr. Doig as one of Canada's Top 100 Most Powerful Women. She was honoured by her medical colleagues in 2010 as a recipient of an Exceptional Service Award to the Saskatoon Health Region, and in 2011 was given an Award of Excellence from the College of Family Physicians of Canada. In 2012, Dr. Doig received a University of Saskatchewan Alumni Achievement Award.

Dr. Doig has been an active volunteer and contributor to her community, serving on the boards of the Goldfins Swim Club, Swim Saskatchewan Inc. and Swimming/Natation Canada. She is past president of the Goldfins and Swim Saskatchewan, and she received the Centennial Leadership Award in 2005 from the Saskatchewan government. Dr. Doig is a member of the University and Community Choruses and has a lifelong interest in music and the arts.

Dr. Doig is married to Robert Cowan and they have six children.

BILL WAISER



A specialist in western and northern Canadian history, Dr. Bill Waiser is Professor of History and A.S. Morton Research Chair. Waiser and graduate studies have gone together at the University of Saskatchewan for almost four decades.

Married less than two weeks, Dr. Waiser arrived in Saskatoon in the fall of 1975 to do graduate work in Canadian History. He left with a doctorate, a job offer as Yukon Historian with the Canadian Parks Service, and three kids in tow.

Dr. Waiser returned to Saskatchewan in 1984, this time as a faculty member with the Department of History. His partner Marley, a microbial ecologist, eventually found work as a research scientist with Environment Canada.

Since 1984, Dr. Waiser has supervised thirty-five graduate students through to completion—an average of slightly more than one a year. The students have come from Canada, the United States, Germany, Japan, Sudan, and Nigeria. Their graduate research has covered a wide range of topics, including the early sex trade in Saskatchewan, the Italian homesteading experience, the Saskatchewan Arts Board, the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan during the Second World War, and the Farmers' Siege of Ottawa in 1910. Many of Dr. Waiser's students have gone onto careers in universities and colleges, law and government, archives, museums and other heritage agencies, and even started their own businesses.

Dr. Waiser would be the first to admit that he has greatly benefited from supervising graduate students. Their research has found its way into his undergraduate lectures and his many

books, including his award-winning centennial history of the province, *Saskatchewan: A New History*. Whenever possible, Dr. Waiser has also tried to incorporate his students' findings into his outreach and engagement activities. He learned from one thesis, for example, that there were more television sets than flush toilets in the province in 1966 because electricity, and not indoor plumbing, came first to rural Saskatchewan. Or that there were more horses than people in Saskatchewan in the mid-1920s because of the reliance of draught animals in agriculture. This kind of information has enlivened his public talks throughout the province and across Canada. It was also used in the history series, *Looking Back*, that he once hosted on CBC Saskatchewan television.

Dr. Waiser has been awarded the Saskatchewan Order of Merit, elected a fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, named a distinguished university professor, and granted a D.Litt. One of the things he values most about his thirty-year career at the University of Saskatchewan is the opportunity to work with young scholars and share the excitement that comes with their research discoveries.

JOHN P. GIESY



John P. Giesy, Ph.D., FRSC is one of the world's premier environmental toxicologists. He has devoted his life to identifying some of the most dangerous pollutants in the environment and working with governments and industry to set environmental policy and change industrial practices based on sound scientific evidence. His mantra: Sustainable economic empowerment has shaped his career and, along the way, changed the course of our planet for the better.

Prof. Giesy is a member of the Academy of Sciences, Royal Society of Canada, Division of Earth, Ocean and Atmospheric Sciences, Discipline of Earth Sciences and Einstein Professor of the Chinese Academy of Sciences. He received the BS in Biology, Summa Cum Laude from Alma College and M.Sc and Ph.D in Limnology from Michigan State University in 1971 and 1974, respectively. He is currently Professor and Canada Research Chair at the University of Saskatchewan on the faculties of Veterinary Biomedical Sciences and Toxicology Centre and Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Zoology at MSU.

Prof. Giesy has published 895 works: 80 book chapters, 739 peer-reviewed open literature journal articles, and written 7 books. He is in the top 0.001% cited of all authors in the world and the most cited (22,000 citations) author in ecology and environment with a h-index of 72. He is an advisor to governments and industries around the world and is currently on the US EPA Science Advisory Board and was the chairperson of the first and only Board of Review for the Canadian minister of the Environment.

Prof. Giesy is the recipient of a number of awards, including: Chevron Distinguished Lectureship Award, CIBA GEIGY Agricultural Recognition Award, Willard F. Shepard Award from the Michigan Water Pollution Control Association, Vollenweider Medal for Environment from the National Water Research Institute of Canada, Founders Award, which is the highest award given by the Society of Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry for continued excellence in research and education, SETAC/Menzie-Cura Environmental Education Award, International Man of the Year in Environmental Science, QUINTESSENCE Award, Distinguished Alumni Award from Alma College, Sir E.W. Russell Award in the Sciences from the British Soil Science Society. In 2012 he was recognized with the Scientific Committee on Problems of the Environment (SCOPE) with the SCOPE-Zhongyu Environmental Sciences Life Achievements Award and in 2013 received the Mirowski Romanowski Award for environment from the Royal Society of Canada.

DEBBIE PUSHOR



As a Master Teacher, Dr. Debbie Pushor's mindful and positive regard of the personal and professional interests of her students, contextualized in a deep understanding of the field of Education, provides superlative and ongoing support. Her work is indeed transformative, and she touches all who know her with wisdom, insight, and compassion.

Colleagues view with awe the myriad ways that Dr. Pushor supports the College of Education and the university. Dr. Pushor currently balances

29 graduate students with a full load of teaching in addition to research that includes work with a northern community interested in parent engagement and curricular improvements. In addition, she consistently teaches reading/independent study courses outside her regular assigned duties. Blending research and teaching, Dr. Pushor publishes in well-known peer-reviewed journals and her work at conferences—from invited keynotes for school divisions as well as at the university level—is both prolific and highly regarded.

It is not surprising that the goals emerging in prominent places on Dr. Pushor's course syllabi include "student engagement", and that testimonials from her previous and current graduate students refer to qualities such as "energetic," "engaged," and "caring." Sincerity is evident not only in the statements she makes in her teaching philosophy, but in how these statements are actualized in all that she does.

Letters collected in light of Dr. Pushor's award nomination have paid exceptional tribute. Ideas from these testimonials appear in the poem that follows, attesting to the breadth of Dr. Pushor's role as an educator.

LENNARD FOX



Lennard Fox has spent more than 15 years providing customer service to University of Saskatchewan students who have questions about their accounts or want to pay their tuition, and as the contact person for First Nations and international communities sponsoring student tuition. He is, for many students, the 'face' of the university and his dedication to that role has earned him the President's Service Award for 2013.

As a clerical services worker in Student Accounts and Treasury, Mr. Fox embodies the strategy from the university's third integrated plan that reads, "We will provide a safe and welcoming environment—in attitude, in support services and in infrastructure." Every student he meets is greeted with warmth and kindness, and Mr. Fox goes out of his way to ensure they get the service they need.

Mr. Fox is very proud of his Aboriginal heritage and understands that a university can be a daunting place. His willingness to go the extra mile includes speaking to groups of Aboriginal and international students about his experiences as an Aboriginal employee and about the services the university provides. He shares the same information with post-secondary counsellors and at employer career fairs.

In an interview about his perspective as an employee, Mr. Fox was asked what connections are important to him. "All of them," he said, "but especially dealing with Aboriginal people and having the chance to help other people from foreign countries and cultures Because of my

own experiences, I don't make judgments about people; I get to know them first."

In addition to being known as invariably warm and polite, Mr. Fox is recognized by many nominators for taking a personal interest in students whose circumstances jeopardize their success at university. There are accounts of Mr. Fox going to extraordinary lengths for individual students, doing everything from ensuring continuity of service for them to following up personally with words of advice and encouragement.

According to one particular account, "Lennard spent nearly six months advocating for a student when her band provided no communication about her funding status. Lennard stepped in, repeatedly approaching the band in an attempt to get answers for the student so she could formulate an appropriate plan of action."

It is his commitment to students and to the university that makes Mr. Fox a worthy recipient of the 2013 President's Service Award.

ERIKA DYCK



The New Researcher Award recognizes a faculty member's contributions to scholarship through the creation, expansion and critique of knowledge. Erika Dyck, associate professor and Canada Research Chair in the Department of History, is the 2013 recipient.

Dr. Dyck is recognized by national and international colleagues as an expert in the history of psychiatry and mental health. She joined the University of Saskatchewan in

2008 as Canada Research Chair in the History of Health and Medicine and is contributing critical knowledge to the evolution of mental health care in Canada. In 2008 John Hopkins University Press published Dr. Dyck's monograph *Psychedelic Psychiatry: LSD from Clinic to Campus*, a book detailing the history of LSD experimentation in Saskatchewan in the post-World War Two era. In 2011 that book was republished by the University of Manitoba Press. Currently, her research revolves around the historical, medical and political attitudes towards reproductive rights for people considered mentally or physically disabled in her newest book, *Facing Eugenics: Reproduction, Sterilization and the Politics of Choice*, published this fall by the University of Toronto Press. She is also co-editor of two collections of chapters by distinguished medical and scientific historians, including *Locating Health: Explorations of Healing and Place*—a volume on the impact of location on health care—and another on the historical uses of humans in experiments since the 17th century. She is the guest editor of two thematic collections; one entitled *After the Asylum / Après l'asile*, exploring the fate of

patients after closing large-scale institutions, and the other on the international scope of eugenics in the 20th century.

Dr. Dyck was a key member of a Canada-wide team that collected and digitized a wide range of materials related to mental health and deinstitutionalization on a website www.historyofmadness.ca. The website now hosts a growing library of digitized materials related to mental health and the perspectives of mental health patients, and survivors of the Alberta Eugenics program. The broad scope of Dr. Dyck's research is illustrated by the significant funding she has received from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, the Saskatchewan Health Research Foundation and the Canada Foundation for Innovation.

She holds a PhD in history from McMaster University (2005), an MA from the U of S and a BA from Dalhousie University. Before joining the faculty of the Department of History, Dr. Dyck was an Assistant Professor and the co-director of the Medical History program at the University of Alberta.

LALITA BHARADWAJ



Dr. Lalita Bharadwaj is committed to finding solutions and understanding issues associated with inequitable access, supply and provision of safe sustainable drinking water supplies for First Nations, rural and remote Saskatchewan communities. Through her community-based participatory research activities she has provided learning opportunities for university and local students, facilitated regional, national and international interdisciplinary research collaborations and has benefited from the opportunities to build research capacity at the local and university level.

Dr. Bharadwaj is a toxicologist in the School of Public Health. Her areas of expertise include human and environmental health risk assessment, and community-based participatory research. Dr. Bharadwaj has performed numerous human and environmental risk assessments on brownfield sites, impacted by creosote, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons and heavy metals. She has contributed to the development of Saskatoon's River Landing by providing her expertise to the City of Saskatoon. She currently serves as a member of the Council of Canadian Academies Expert Panel on Harnessing Science and Technology to Understand the Environmental Impacts of Shale Gas Extraction.

Dr. Bharadwaj strives to be a university leader in community-based participatory research with Saskatchewan Aboriginal communities. Over the past 10 years she has carefully established a working relationship and partnership with the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations, building strong ties, trust, cooperation and mutual respect using a participatory community approach to her research on water and health. In partnership with her community colleagues she has developed novel community-based research approaches "Science in a Circle", where indigenous and western scientific knowledge

is shared, student mentorship across all levels of education, age and status in the community is promoted, community capacity for research is built and long-lasting "Community Links" among researchers and community members are established. Her participatory community approach has extended to global contributions. She has worked in two different areas in Peru, Chachapoyas and Huaraz, where she fostered collaborative research and knowledge-sharing between sectors of government, health, education, non-profit organization, academics and Indigenous communities on issues of water supply, quality and policy. Both projects depend on community involvement, something at which she excels. Dr. Bharadwaj has also contributed to the development of the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations Safe Drinking Water Program. This program promotes self-determination and community capacity for water quality testing, monitoring and management. As part of her commitment to community engagement, she has worked alongside colleagues from other health science colleges, to conduct summer science camps at the University of Saskatchewan for high school students from northern Aboriginal communities.

GLEN HAUSER



Glen Hauser graduated from the University of Saskatchewan as a mechanical engineer in 1992. He returned to the university as the College of Engineering's information technology manager in 2003. As manager, he led various projects to advance student access to specialized computer software and enhance the efficiency and accuracy of scholarly and research activities through technology, which aided in the college's accreditation process.

For seven years Glen volunteered his time as faculty advisor for Huskie Motorsports, the college's student-led Formula SAE race team that designs, builds and races a racecar. Glen's expertise in information technology helped the team work with computer modelling in the design and engineering of the car. Under his leadership, the squad grew from a small group of engineers struggling to keep the team going, to a thriving cross-disciplinary team that utilizes the knowledge and experience of students across campus—such as finance and marketing students from the Edwards School of Business—allowing the team to represent the University of Saskatchewan at a consistently high level at international competitions. Glen helped start the fledgling mini baja and aero design teams as well.

Glen volunteers, and served as president, with the Saskatoon Soap Box Derby club, assisting children race in gravity powered soapbox derby cars. He helps the children understand the physics of aerodynamics and rolling resistance to build faster cars.

Combining his roles with Huskie Motorsports and as a long-serving volunteer with Scouts Canada, Glen was active with the university's Sci-Fi Science Camps, teaching children the physics behind the design of wooden Kub Kars. He also arranged for motorsport students to help camp participants build their cars, and he worked with the camp staff to help the scouts build electric race cars.

Glen is also an active volunteer with Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Saskatoon, serving as their "computer guy" to maintain the organization's hardware and software. He is also a long-standing member of the Knights of Columbus and currently serves as treasurer on the executive of a local council.

Glen's service to the university and community outreach as a volunteer make him a deserving recipient for the University of Saskatchewan's Award for Distinction in Outreach and Public Service.

JULIE ELIZABETH GAILIUS

Julie was raised in British Columbia and completed the first year of her degree at the University of Northern British Columbia before transferring to the University of Saskatchewan in 2011. Today she graduates with a Bachelor of Science Three-year Degree with a major in Microbiology and Immunology with Great Distinction. Julie is the recipient of the President's Medal, which is awarded to the student with the highest cumulative average graduating with an undergraduate degree at the University of Saskatchewan.

Julie has excelled academically and been awarded numerous scholarships and awards during her academic program. She was the recipient of an NSERC Undergraduate Student Research Award. Julie also received the John Bankier Award, the John Spencer Middleton and Jack Spencer Gordon Middleton Scholarship and a University of Saskatchewan Transfer Scholarship.

In addition to maintaining her record of academic distinction, Julie's interests include environmental causes with a focus on sustainability. She is also an avid runner who
