THE CHANCELLOR

BLAINE FAVEL



Blaine is the chancellor of the University of Saskatchewan. He has over 20 years of experience in First Nations business development as an advisor, entrepreneur and Chief. As an influential Plains Cree leader, he has made significant contributions to scholarship, education, public service and the Canadian public good. He was Chief of the Poundmaker Cree Nation and served as Grand Chief of the Federation of

Saskatchewan Indian Nations from 1994-98.

Blaine received his Bachelor of Education degree from the College of Education at the University of Saskatchewan, his law degree at Queen's University, and a master's degree in business administration from Harvard Business School. He resides in Calgary, Alberta, and is the proud father to five children.



Our ceremony

The convocation ceremony is a calling together of the new graduates of the University of Saskatchewan, symbolizing the historical practice of calling together all former graduates. In current times, the major functions of convocation

are the election of representatives to university governing bodies and the admission of candidates to degrees. The chancellor, appointed by senate as the chair of convocation, is the highest official and spokesperson of the university.

The convocation ceremony marks the transition from the role of student to the holder of a degree with its accompanying rights and privileges.

The ceremony, solemnized in the presence of the university community and family and friends of the graduands, consists of three parts: a procession marking the leaving of the old status and entering the new; the president's statement to the graduands, the secretary's petition and the chancellor's consent for their admission; followed by individual presentation by a university orator and admission by the chancellor to the degrees to which they are entitled.

As graduates are admitted to their degrees, a graduation hood, which has a colour symbolizing a particular degree, is placed over each graduate's head.

ENTRANCE

Graduands in their academic dress march in procession into the ceremony in the following order: graduands in the order in which their degrees are to be conferred; faculty; board of governors; senate; guests of honour; the president; the chancellor; the lieutenant governor. When the members of convocation reach their places they remain standing during the Vice-Regal Salute, the singing of "O Canada" and the invocation.

ORDER OF THE CEREMONY

The first business is the conferring of honorary degrees, followed by convocation address, president's statement to the graduands, the conferring of degrees and the presentation of awards. The meeting is closed by the chancellor rising and leading the procession in the reverse order out of the hall.

THE PETITION

The university secretary on behalf of all the candidates, addresses the chancellor and senate in the following words:

"Eminent Chancellor, Mr. President, members of the University Senate and Board, I present to you the petition of the Council of this University that the candidates to be named, having fulfilled all the requirements of the bylaws, may, with your permission, be admitted to the degrees and certificates to which they are entitled".



THE ADMISSION

The chancellor then addresses the candidates:

"By virtue of the authority vested in me by the legislature of this province, and with the consent of the council of this university, I consent to admit you to the degrees and certificates to which you are entitled and to invest you with all the powers, rights and privileges pertaining thereto."

THE PRESENTATION

The university orator approaches the chancellor from the left and presents the candidates:

"Eminent Chancellor, on behalf of the faculty of _____, I present to you these scholars and ask that you will confer on them the degree of _____."

Each candidate then comes forward and the degree hood is placed on his or her shoulders. As the orator speaks the candidate's name in full, the candidate moves forward in front of the chancellor. Then the chancellor says, **"I admit you"**. Hereupon the candidate passes to the chancellor's right, is greeted by the dean of the faculty, or designate, and receives the degree parchment.

DEGREES IN ABSENTIA

In such cases, the university secretary says:

"Eminent Chancellor, in the name of the faculties, I ask you to grant the degrees and certificates, in absentia, to those students who have met the requirements to graduate, but were not able to be present today."

ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress lends an element of colourful pageantry to the convocation proceedings. This traditional clothing—worn on a daily basis at universities in earlier times—is now reserved for ceremonial functions.

At the University of Saskatchewan, the following academic dress is adopted for all appropriate occasions: The gown resembles a long cape with full sleeve cut to elbow and terminating in a point for the bachelor's degree; with long sleeve and a semi-circular cut at the bottom for the master's degree; and with round open sleeves for the doctor's degree. The material is black broadcloth for the bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees. The doctoral gown incorporates green and gold on the front and sleeve panels.

The hoods for the bachelor's and master's degrees are of black broadcloth. The master's and doctor's hoods have a lining and the bachelor's an edging (and in some cases, a lining) of a color distinctive of the character of the degree.

Ph.D. hoods have a green satin lining with gold trim and the honorary degree hoods feature a white satin trim. A velvet Beefeater style hat with a green, gold and white tassel is also part of the doctoral dress.

Aboriginal culture

At the U of S, we have one of the highest populations of Aboriginal students among Canadian post-secondary institutions. As indicated in our Third Integrated Plan, one of our most influential documents, it is important to us to

include Indigenous knowledge and experience into our daily practices, curriculum and celebrations. At convocation, one of our most important celebrations, we display the Treaty No. 6 flag, Métis flag and sing an honour song.

HONOUR SONG

These are special songs to demonstrate respect for an individual or group in recognition of their accomplishments such as a return from military service or other events. In some families, individuals have their own song, which is sung for them when they are being honoured.





MÉTIS FLAG

The Métis flag has been a symbol for the Métis Nation since as early as 1816. The infinity is a representation of the joining of two cultures—forever intertwined, a people forever. The flag is nationally recognized by the Métis Nation across Canada.



GRADUATION POWWOW

The University of Saskatchewan Graduation Powwow is a celebration of the accomplishments of Aboriginal Students. The Graduation powwow highlights First Nation, Métis and Inuit students with song, dance and honoring the commitment of everyone involved in the post-secondary experience. We are proud to host such an event that gives Aboriginal people an opportunity to show case culture and academics.

University orators

Our 11 orators hail from all parts of campus and perform a wide range of roles throughout the university, but all are gifted with resonant voices, pronunciation skills and share a fine attention to detail.

The post of university orator can be traced back hundreds of years to universities in the United Kingdom such as Oxford and Cambridge. Traditionally orators served as the official voice of the university, composing letters, giving speeches in Latin at ceremonial occasions and presenting candidates for honorary degrees.


Brian Gable (BA'70)

His work has appeared in The New York Times, The International Herald Tribune, Time Magazine, The Guardian, Prospect Magazine, among others. He has been nominated for the National Newspaper Award 15 times and has won the award six times. While at the U of S, Gable grew his creative talent as a cartoonist for The Sheaf.



Jaris Swidrovich (BSP'10)

is the 2016 recipient of the USSU Engaged Young Alumni Award. He completed his Doctor of Pharmacy at the University of Toronto, where he became the first self-identified First Nations Doctor of Pharmacy in Canada. Swidrovich has won several awards, including the National Patient Care Enhancement Award from the Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists. He is involved with many non-profit organizations, including the student-run clinic, SWITCH. He is currently a lecturer at the College of Pharmacy and Nutrition.



Dr. Ryan Meili (BSC'00, MD'04) is a family doctor at the Westside Community Clinic in Saskatoon and an assistant professor in the U of S College of Medicine. Meili is committed to improving the health of Canadians: he serves as vice-chair of Canadian Doctors of Medicare, is a Broadbent Institute Fellow, an Evidence Network expert and is the founding director of Upstream: Institute for a Health Society.



Shauna Curry (BE'94) is the CEO of CAWST, Centre for Affordable Water and Sanitation Technology. The organization teaches people how to get safe drinking water and sanitation using affordable technology. Curry led the development and expansion of CAWST's service delivery from two countries to its current network of 970 implementing clients in 78 countries. These organizations have impacted 11.4 million people with safe drinking water or sanitation.



Lynne Van Luven (BA'68) is a highly-respected journalist, editor and author. After her time at the U of S, she went on to earn her master's and Ph.D. in English from the University of Alberta and taught at Carleton University before joining the Department of Writing at the University of Victoria. A regular on CBC Radio's The Arts Tonight and Talking Books, she's served as a prolific member of the writing community and also a judge or juror for several writing awards.



WILLIAM DEVERELL



While working his way through two degrees at the University of Saskatchewan, Bill Deverell was a journalist for seven years, graduating in law in 1963. He was a member of the bars of British Columbia, Alberta and the Yukon, and his practice involved both prosecuting and defending, civil rights, labour and environmental law. He is a founding director, former president, now honorary director of the BC Civil Liberties Association.

His first novel, *Needles*, won the \$50,000 Seal Prize in 1979 and the Book of the Year Award in 1981. His subsequent novels include *High Crimes*, *Mecca*, *The Dance of Shiva*, *Platinum Blues*, *Mindfield*, *Kill All the Lawyers*, *Street Legal*, *Trial of Passion*, *Slander*, *The Laughing Falcon*, *Mind Games*, *April Fool*, *Kill All the Judges*, *Snow Job*, *I'll See You in My Dreams* and *Sing a Worried Song*. He is author of the true crime book *A Life on Trial – the Case of Robert Frisbee*, based on a celebrated murder trial which he defended. His novels have been translated into fourteen languages and sold worldwide. All but two continue in print.

Trial of Passion won the 1997 Dashiell Hammett Award, for literary excellence in crime writing in North America, as well as the Arthur Ellis Prize in crime writing in Canada. It featured the classically trained, self-doubting Arthur Beauchamp, a trial lawyer who became Deverell's first series protagonist, in *April Fool* (also an Ellis winner), *Kill All the Judges* (shortlisted for the Stephen Leacock Prize in

humour), and *Snow Job*, a political novel set in Ottawa, also a Leacock runner-up. He has been referred to as a national treasure by the *Toronto Star* and received the Best Canadian Crime Writer award at the Scene of the Crime Festival in Ontario. In October, 2011, he was awarded an honorary doctor of letters from Simon Fraser University and five years later is now receiving a second honorary D. Litt from the University of Saskatchewan, which holds his archives.

Mr. Deverell wrote the screenplay *Shellgame* for CBC-TV drama, which served as the pilot for CBC's long-running series *Street Legal*, and he is the creator of that series, which has run internationally in more than 50 countries. In 1991-92, he served as Visiting Professor in the creative writing department at the University of Victoria. In 1994 he served as chair of the Writers' Union of Canada, and again in 1999. He lives on Pender Island, British Columbia.

HONORARY DOCTOR OF SCIENCE

KARIM (KAY) W. NASSER



Born and raised in Lebanon, Karim (Kay) Nasser earned his Bachelor of Science in Engineering at the American University in Beirut, his master's degree in Kansas, and his Ph.D. at the University of Saskatchewan, where he served as a professor of civil engineering for 33 years.

Dr. Nasser's research led to the invention of the K-slump tester, a device that easily tests the consistency, or slump, of concrete when it is poured. The tester was used in the construction of Toronto's CN Tower in 1973 and is still widely used today.

Using a line of credit from the bank and his

engineering expertise, Dr. Nasser constructed several apartment buildings throughout Saskatoon. In time, Victory Majors Investment Corporation was formed to handle the management of the properties.

Dr. Nasser and his wife, Dora (also a U of S graduate), have five children—Selma, Mona, John, Roseann and May—who all studied at the U of S. The Nasser family has been consistent and generous supporters of the U of S for over 45 years. Kay recognizes he would not be where he is today without the financial assistance of others, and as a result the Nasser family is passionate about helping others achieve their educational goals.

DISTINGUISHED GRADUATE SUPERVISOR AWARD

JANE ALCORN



Jane Alcorn holds a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from the Western College of Veterinary Medicine, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Pharmaceutical Sciences from the University of Kentucky. She joined the College of Pharmacy and Nutrition at the University of Saskatchewan (U of S) as a faculty member in July 2001. Her research focuses on the determinants of neonatal exposure risk in medicated nursing mothers

and on the pharmacology and health benefits of flaxseed bioactives. She is a member of the U of S's multidisciplinary Drug Discovery and Development Research Group, which she chaired between 2009 and 2014. Dr. Alcorn received a Distinguished Researcher Award from the University of Saskatchewan in 2007, and a Centennial Alumni of Influence Award from the College of Pharmacy and Nutrition in 2014. In addition to her research and teaching activities, Dr. Alcorn has been the University Veterinarian from 2011 to 2016 and on the board of directors for the Canadian Society for Pharmaceutical Sciences since January 2015 as well as the Saskatchewan Health Research Foundation since May 2016.

Despite these varied faculty responsibilities, Dr. Alcorn prioritizes her students' research experiences and is known to provide them with exceptional attention and support. Since the start of her U of S faculty position, Dr. Alcorn has supervised and graduated four

Ph.D. students (two as a co-supervisor) and 12 master's students (five as co-supervisor). She currently co-supervises another five Ph.D. students and two Master's students. She has been an advisory committee member for a further 37 graduated students. Dr. Alcorn encourages her students to publish and to present their work at major conferences. She also encourages them to apply for scholarships and awards, and has attracted excellent students capable of receiving such honours. By encouraging and assisting in these activities, Dr. Alcorn strives to prepare her students for successful lives and careers, and she has clearly been successful.

Dr. Jane Alcorn is very deserving of this award for her unwavering dedication to graduate students and graduate programming over the last 15 years. The successes of her former students and the extent to which they themselves support her for this award are a true testament to her excellence as a graduate supervisor.

CHRIS CLARK



Chris Clark graduated from Cambridge University with a B.A. (Honours) and a VetMB. He obtained an M.Vet.Sc and a Ph.D. from the University of Saskatchewan. He also is a Diplomat of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine. He began teaching as a graduate student and, since joining as a faculty member in 2002, Dr. Clark has emerged as one of the highly accomplished teachers of his generation. He has earned the respect of students and his peers through his highly engaged, collaborative, and innovative art and practise of teaching.

Among nearly a dozen teaching awards that Dr. Clark has received is the Norden Distinguished Teaching Award. This is the most prestigious teaching award in veterinary medicine, and Chris has already received it twice (2004 and 2009). His impact on students' learning and success is measured not by awards, however, but by the warm and heartfelt comments from his students, one of which says, "There are of course a lot of brilliant teachers here, but he is more than just a great teacher. He's through and through a great person."

Dr. Clark has combined his individual teaching prowess with his high quality and high intensity team teaching. The Biomedical Rounds course at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine would not have been possible without his participation, leadership and contributions as one of five designated leaders for the Rounds. The Rounds have been recognized with the Provost's Award for Innovative Practice of Teaching at the University of Saskatchewan and an Honorable Mention in the Alan Blizzard Award for Collaboration in University Learning of the

Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education.

Dr. Clark is an exceptional communicator. During the "mad cow disease" crisis, Dr. Clark emerged as the main spokesperson for the college, the university and the veterinary medical profession. He presented highly balanced and science-based perspectives on the subject on national television and radio programs to calm the public and enhance the profile of the University of Saskatchewan. His outreach efforts continue to bring attention to the work of our university and his efforts were recognized with Public Relations Award of the Saskatchewan Veterinary Medical Association and the Veterinarian of the Year Award of the Western Canadian Association of Bovine Practitioners.

About his his teaching and scholarly work, Dr. Clark claims "I always wanted to be a veterinarian and I love being a veterinarian. However, when students touring the veterinary college have asked me "What is your favorite part of being a veterinarian?" I always reply "Teaching students about veterinary medicine."

CARIN HOLROYD



Carin Holroyd has worked and studied extensively around the world and holds degrees from UBC, Chaminade University of Honolulu, Sophia University (Japan), and a Ph.D. from the University of Waikato in New Zealand. Carin first joined the University of Saskatchewan in 2000 as a post-doctoral fellow in the College of Commerce before becoming the Director of Student Support Services, including oversight of the International Students and Study Abroad Centre. Dr. Holroyd then held research and faculty positions at the Centre for International Governance Innovation and the Department of Political Science, University of Waterloo before returning to the University of

Saskatchewan in 2012 as Associate Professor, Department of Political Studies and Director of the International Studies Program, College of Arts and Science. As one of the few Asian/Japanese Studies specialists at the University of Saskatchewan, Dr. Holroyd is active in numerous on-campus activities and events related to Asian affairs. Dr. Holroyd is also one of Canada's leading Japan Studies specialists, and is frequently invited to speak at national and international conferences, colleges and universities on her area of expertise.

Dr. Holroyd is the president of the Japan Studies Association of Canada and is the founder and president of the Vietnam Education Society, a charity devoted to addressing the educational challenges facing children in rural Vietnam. The Government of Vietnam honoured her in 2015 for her dedication and commitment to raising funds and establishing schools, lunch programs and scholarships. In May 2016, Dr. Holroyd received the Governor General of Canada award, a Meritorious Service Medal for her charitable and community work related to the Vietnam Education Society. Dr. Holroyd has helped raise over \$700,000, build nine different educational facilities in rural Vietnam and provide funding for annual summer camps and school support

for young girls at risk of human trafficking. In May 2015, Dr. Holroyd was accepted to the UNICEF 25th Team, established to support Canada's leadership on maternal and child health. It is a team of 60 women who will invest over four years in life-saving projects in Cambodia, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Namibia and Peru. The investment will help more than two million women and children.

Dr. Holroyd has taught introductory and capstone courses in the International Studies program. Her classes attract significant numbers of international and domestic students interested in international affairs. She promotes study abroad, international volunteer engagement, and exchange opportunities to her students, offering support to those interested in overseas experiences, to ensure successful participation in these valuable programs. Dr. Holroyd encourages her students to engage globally, to make major and sustained contributions to international understanding through scholarship.

Dr. Holroyd is a valuable asset to the growth in international engagement at the University of Saskatchewan, and a worthy recipient of the J.W. George Ivany Award for Internationalization.

PRESIDENT'S SERVICE AWARD

LIZ SCOTT



Liz Scott has been an integral part of the administrative team of the School of Physical Therapy for the past 25 years, in positions with increasing responsibility year after year. Currently the executive assistant for the school, Liz's commitment to—and pride

for—the school and university is evident in all she does.

Always willing and able to take on new challenges, in her role as executive assistant, Liz is responsible for areas including finance, human resources, administration and office management. TIMOTHY KELLY



The New Researcher Award is given every year to a faculty member at the University of Saskatchewan who has made outstanding contributions to his or her discipline. Timothy Kelly, Associate Professor in the Department of Chemistry and Canada Research Chair in Photovoltaics, is the 2016 recipient of this prestigious honour.

Dr. Kelly received his B.Sc. from Memorial University in 2005; he then completed his Ph.D. in Materials Chemistry in 2009 at the University of British Columbia. After an NSERC postdoctoral fellowship at the University of California, San Diego, Dr. Kelly joined the U of S Department of Chemistry in 2011.

Dr. Kelly is a prolific and highly-regarded researcher in sustainable energy, specifically in the field of photovoltaics (solar cells). Research in this area aims to produce new solar cells that are both efficient and inexpensive to manufacture. Dr. Kelly and his group are producing the next generation of solar cells, called perovskite solar cells, that show promise of being able to be produced more simply and cheaply using low-temperature solution-processing methods. This breakthrough research was first reported in 2014 in the prestigious journal *Nature Photonics*. The paper had more than 20,000 views in the

first year it was available and has been cited over 900 times to date. Follow up papers have been published in prestigious journals like *ACS Nano* and the *Journal of the American Chemical Society*, and a provisional US patent was filed in 2013. Just five years after beginning his academic career at the University of Saskatchewan, Dr. Kelly and his group are world leaders in photovoltaics.

Since coming to the U of S, Dr. Kelly has been awarded research grants in excess of \$1.5 million, built a world-class laboratory, and put together a research group of eleven, including one post-doctoral fellow and nine graduate students. He has given invited lectures at institutions such as the University of California, Santa Barbara and the University of Florida, is frequently asked to be a reviewer for top journals, and currently sits on the Editorial Advisory Board for the journal *ACS Energy Letters*.

SARAH BUHLER



The University of Saskatchewan Award for Community Engaged Teaching and Scholarship was established in 2013 to honour faculty members who have contributed with distinction to the university's community engagement mission. Sarah Buhler, associate professor in the College of Law, is the Fall 2016 recipient of this honour.

Professor Buhler received her B.A. from the University of Winnipeg in 1997, her LL.B from

York University's Osgoode Hall Law School in 2002, and her LL.M. from the University of Saskatchewan's College of Law in 2011. After doing significant work in the legal field, including as an Associate Lawyer at Scharfstein Gibbins Walen Fisher LLP and as Executive Director and Supervising Lawyer of Community Legal Assistance Services for Saskatoon Inner City (CLASSIC), Professor Buhler took up an appointment of Assistant Professor (tenure-track) in the College of Law in 2010.


Since coming to the University of Saskatchewan, Professor Buhler has done exemplary community engaged scholarship and teaching. She remains heavily involved in CLASSIC, a legal clinic that provides service to residents of Saskatoon who would not otherwise have support in navigating the justice system. Professor Buhler oversees the clinical law program connected with CLASSIC, and teaches law students who volunteer there. A winner of the Provost's Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2015, Professor Buhler's outstanding community

engaged teaching and scholarship is also seen in her partnership with colleagues in the Department of English, the Department of Indigenous Studies, Oskayak High School, and Str8 UP in developing a course where law students, members of Str8 Up, Indigenous Studies students, and Oskayak high school students learn together about community development and access to justice.

In addition to her innovative teaching, Professor Buhler has also developed a strong reputation as a scholar of access to justice, and particularly in her exploration of how members of marginalized communities experience legal services and the justice system. Professor Buhler engages community members as co-designers and co-facilitators of her research, and her work is making a major contribution to understanding how the justice system can serve everyone fairly.

Professor Buhler won the University of Saskatchewan's Award for Distinction in Outreach and Engagement in 2008

JOHN MCKINNON



The University of Saskatchewan Award for Distinction in Outreach and Public Service was established in 2002 to honour employees who have contributed greatly to the achievement of the university's outreach mission. The award recognizes exemplary contributions of university staff and faculty members undertaking efforts that are meaningful and responsive to community interests and needs, and reflect positively on the university as a whole. John McKinnon, Professor and Saskatchewan Beef Industry Chair in the

College of Agriculture and Bioresources, is the Fall 2016 recipient of this honour.

Professor McKinnon received his B.Sc. from the University of Manitoba (1978), and his MSc. (1986) and Ph.D. (1992) from the University of Saskatchewan. Before coming to the University of Saskatchewan in 1992, Professor McKinnon worked in the cattle industry in Western Canada for years, including as Cattle Buyer (1978-82) and as a Beef Specialist with Manitoba Agriculture (1984-86).

Throughout his career at the University of Saskatchewan, Professor McKinnon has demonstrated exceptional and sustained commitment to research, outreach, and education through his work with the Canadian beef industry. He has done innovative research in nutrition and management, has trained future leaders in the industry, and transferred expert knowledge and technologies to the industry. He has done extensive service with the Beef Science Cluster for the Canadian Cattleman's Association and the Advisory Board for

Verified Beef Production, as well as with many other agricultural organizations across the country. Professor McKinnon also writes a popular monthly column in the *Canadian Cattleman's Magazine*, a national beef magazine that targets all sectors of Canada's beef industry. He has, to date, published 145 peer-reviewed articles and is a noted teacher. He has supervised over 35 graduate students who have gone on to successful careers in academics, government, and a variety of positions in the agricultural industry.

Professor McKinnon has won numerous awards and honours for his work. He won the Canadian Society of Animal Science Award for Excellence in Nutrition and Meat Sciences in 2006 in recognition of his scientific contributions to the field. He was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal for service to the Canadian Cattle industry in 2013 and was the inaugural recipient of the Canadian Beef Industry Award for Outstanding Research and Innovation in 2015.

ALICE LOUISE GODSON

Alice Louise Godson is graduating from the College of Arts & Science with a Bachelor of Arts Honours degree with High Honours in International Studies.

Alice has excelled academically while at the University of Saskatchewan. Her achievements have been recognized by the numerous awards and scholarships she has received over the last four years.

One of her professors describes Alice as someone who has already made her International Studies training and university education count for real change in the world. In addition to her employment and volunteer work, her overall academic performance was in the top two percent. Alice initiated

a discussion about sponsoring a refugee to come to Saskatoon to pursue graduate studies and because of her diligence this individual was offered a position in the department's graduate program.

Alice has volunteered in several areas including the Festival Tam Tam Macadam celebrating and welcoming cultures from around the world; the Saskatoon Food Bank and Learning Centre by preparing needs assessment survey reports, packaging food and folding clothes; as a student refugee coordinator for the World University Service of Canada; as a speaker with the University of Saskatchewan's Winter Orientation group, and as a Disability Student Services Notetaker, to name a few activities.

In her spare time, Alice's extracurricular experiences have included her position as a delegate of the Harvard National Model United Nations, as an executive member of the International Studies Student Association and participant in Women in the Legislature.

Alice enjoys traveling and learning about different cultures and participates in outdoor activities such as soccer, canoeing, biking, camping and cross-country skiing. Many of her extra-curricular activities have centered on her work with international students, immigrants and refugees making immigration and international education an area of interest when considering her future career.
