W. THOMAS MOLLOY



Mr. Molloy was born and raised in Saskatoon. He attended St. Thomas More College and later the College of Law, both at the University of Saskatchewan. He received his B.A. and LL.B. in 1964. He has practised law in Saskatoon since graduation and is with the MacPherson Leslie & Tyerman Saskatoon office. He has represented the Government of Canada as the Chief Federal Negotiator in the successfully concluded treaties with the Inuit of Nunavut, with the Nisga'a in British Columbia and with the Inuit of Northern Quebec Offshore and Labrador claim. He has represented Canada in treaty negotiations in British Columbia, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Yukon, North West Territories and Nunavut. Mr. Molloy has been described as "Canada's most expert treaty negotiator".

He recently authored a book *The World is our Witness: The Historic Journey of the Nisga'a into Canada.* The book has won two Saskatchewan Book Awards, The Brenda MacDonald Riches First Book Award and the Non-fiction Award which was sponsored by the University of Saskatchewan.

For his work in the community he has received a number of awards including the City of Saskatoon Certificate of Distinguished Community Service; Rotary Golden Wheels Award for Excellence, Saskatoon B'nai Brith "Proud of You Award", and the Head of the Public Service Award for Excellence in Service Delivery. In 1996 he was made an officer of the Order of Canada, with a citation that reads:

He is widely known for his role as Chief Negotiator for the Government of Canada in the Nunavut Land Claim Agreement. His integrity, commitment to a just settlement and personable rapport have also been valuable in his leadership of numerous cultural, educational and charitable groups, not only in Saskatchewan but also nationally, including the Meewasin Foundation and PRIDE Canada.

The University of Saskatchewan Alumni Association awarded him the 2000 Alumni Honour Award in recognition of receiving notable acclaim for professional achievements, which in turn has enhanced the image of the University of Saskatchewan and its alumni. In January, 2001 The Canadian Bar Association Saskatchewan Branch named him as the recipient of the Distinguished Service Award.

he University of Saskatchewan was established by the University Act on April 3, 1907, only 18 months after Saskatchewan became a province.

The people of the province, as well as their government, were instrumental in shaping the new University. The provincial government requested all residents who were graduates of a Canadian or British university to form the first Convocation and elect the University's Senate. In 1908, the Board selected Professor Walter Charles Murray, of Dalhousie University, as the first President.

Classes in Arts and Science began

in September, 1909, in downtown Saskatoon. Construction of the campus began in 1910 and the first buildings were occupied in the fall of 1912. They included the College Building (Administration Building), Saskatchewan Hall (a student residence), residences for the Dean of Agriculture and the President, a laboratory for Engineering and a number of farm buildings.

From the beginning, the University established an emphasis on research and teaching in a context of community service, and encouraged co-operation among departments and divisions in tackling common problems. The development of

rust-resistant strains of wheat, for example, initiated by the University and federal and provincial research agencies, has been of untold value to the prairie economy.

In 1909, the University had 70 students and five professors, including the President. Today there are over 19,000 students studying in 13 colleges and two schools. This is the only university in Canada with five health-science colleges and a major teaching hospital on the same campus. of I

The University of Saskatchewan overlooks the South Saskatchewan River. Most early buildings on campus are Collegiate Gothic in style and are constructed in a local dolomite, popularly known as greystone. Subsequently constructed buildings also have greystone, as well as Tyndall stone (pre-cut slabs quarried in Tyndall, Manitoba), concrete, brick, glass and aggregate facings.

The University offers many points of interest for visitors: the Diefenbaker Canada Centre, Museum of Natural Sciences, Museum of Antiquities, **Biology** Museum, Pharmaceutical Museum, the Observatory, the **Gordon Snelgrove** Gallery, the St. Thomas More Gallery, Rugby Chapel, the Little Stone Schoolhouse, the Memorial Gates, Patterson Garden and the Kenderdine Gallery.

In 1907, the population of Saskatoon was roughly 4,500 and the province of Saskatchewan, 210,000.

Saskatoon's population today tops 200,000; Saskatchewan's grazes the million mark.

STUDENTS/FACULTY

In 1909, five faculty members taught the first group of 70 students. Classes were initially held in the Drinkle building in downtown Saskatoon.

Currently more than 1,000 faculty members mentor a student body of nearly 20,000.

Colleges

Arts & Science and Agriculture were the first two colleges to be established at the U of S—in 1908 and 1909, respectively. Today, 13 colleges and two schools offer 58 degrees, diplomas and certificates in over 100 areas of study.

TUITION

In 1909, tuition fees were \$6 per class. Today the cost ranges from approximately \$800 to \$1,400 per class.

GRADUATES

In 1912, the U of S honoured its first graduating class of seven students. The ceremony was held at Nutana Collegiate. At this year's Convocation spring and fall ceremonies, we will honour nearly 4,000 new graduates.








Centennial Lily

Centennial Stamp



Canada Post has marked the University of Saskatchewan's 100th anniversary by issuing a commemorative stamp in 2007. The stamp features the U of S logo and an image of the College Building, the heart of the U of S campus.

A Canada Post artist designed the

stamp image and prepared the Official First Day Cover. A collector's item, this special envelope includes a U of S stamp cancelled on the day of issue, as well as information about the institution.

The stamps are available at Canada Post outlets.



• he word "Convocation" arises from the Latin "cum" meaning "together," and "vocare" meaning "to call." Our Convocation ceremony is a calling together of the new graduates of the University of Saskatchewan, symbolizing the *historical practice of calling together* all former graduates. In current times, the major functions of Convocation are the election of representatives to University governing bodies and the admission of candidates to degrees. The Chancellor, elected by Convocation as its Chair, is the highest official and spokesperson of the University.

The Convocation ceremony marks the transition from the role of student to the holder of a degree with its accompanying rights and privileges.

The ceremony, solemnized in the presence of the University community and family and friends of the graduands, consists of three parts: a procession marking the leaving of the old status and entering the new; the President's statement to the graduands, the Secretary's petition and the Chancellor's consent for their admission; followed by individual presentation by their Dean and admission by the Chancellor to the degrees to which they are entitled. As graduates are admitted to their degrees, a graduation hood, which has a colour symbolizing a particular degree, is placed over each graduate's head.

Convocation

ENTRANCE

The members of Convocation in their academic robes march in procession into the ceremony in the following order: Graduands in the order in which their degrees are to be conferred; Faculty; Board of Governors; Senate; Guests of Honour; The President; The Chancellor; The Lieutenant Governor. When the members of Convocation reach their places they remain standing during the Vice-Regal Salute, the singing of *O Canada* and the Invocation.

ORDER OF THE CEREMONY

The first business is the Conferring of Honorary Degrees, followed by Convocation Address, President's Statement to the Graduands, the Conferring of Degrees and the Presentation of Awards. The meeting is closed by the Chancellor rising and asking the audience to join in the singing of *God Save the Queen* and leading the procession in the reverse order out of the hall.

DEGREE CEREMONY

The ceremony comprises the Petition, the Admission, and the Presentation.

THE PETITION

The University Secretary on behalf of all the Candidates, addresses the Chancellor and Senate in these words:

"Eminent Chancellor, President, I present to you the petition that the candidates to be named, having fulfilled all the requirements of the statutes, may be admitted to the degrees and certificates to which they are entitled".

THE ADMISSION

The Chancellor then addresses the candidates in these words:

"By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Legislature of this Province, and with the consent of the Council of this University, I consent to admit you to the degrees and certificates to which you are entitled and to invest you with all the powers, rights and privileges pertaining thereto."

THE PRESENTATION

The Dean of the Faculty, or designate, followed by the candidates of that Faculty, approaches the Chancellor from the left and presents the candidates with these words:

"Eminent Chancellor, on behalf of the Faculty of _____, I present to you these Scholars and ask that you will confer on them the degree of _____." As the Dean speaks the candidate's name in full, the candidate moves forward in front of the Chancellor. Then the Chancellor says, *"I admit you"* and the University Secretary or the Registrar places the hood over the candidate's head. Hereupon the candidate passes to the Chancellor's right, is greeted by the President, and receives the degree parchment.

DEGREES IN ABSENTIA

In such cases, the University Secretary says:

"Eminent Chancellor, in the name of the Faculties, I ask you to grant the degrees and certificates, in absentia, to those students whose names appear in the printed program and who were not able to be present today."

The Chancellor replies:

"At the request of the Faculties I authorize these degrees and certificates to be granted."

ACADEMIC COSTUMES

Academic costume lends an element of colourful pageantry to the Convocation proceedings. This traditional clothing worn on a daily basis at universities in earlier times—is now more commonly reserved for ceremonial functions.

At the University of Saskatchewan, the following academic costume is adopted to be worn upon all appropriate occasions:

The gown resembles a long cape with full sleeve cut to elbow and terminating in a point for the Bachelor's degree; with long sleeve and a semi-circular cut at the bottom for the Master's degree; and with round open sleeves for the Doctor's degree. The material is black for the Bachelor's degree, and black material or silk for the Master's and Doctor's degrees. The Doctor's gown may have a border down the front on either side of a color distinctive of the character of the degree.

The hoods for the Bachelor's and Master's degrees are of black broadcloth. For the Doctor's (Ph.D.) degree the hood is scarlet cloth with a blue lining. The Master's and Doctor's hoods have a lining and the Bachelor's an edging (and in some cases, a lining) of a color distinctive of the character of the degree.

Chancellor – a black silk robe with crimson velvet sleeves, trimmed round the collar and down the front edges with broad gold lace (and round the bottom of the sleeves with narrower gold lace), and a black silk velvet trencher with gold button and tassel.

Vice-Chancellor (President) – same design as the Chancellor's gown and trencher. The Vice-Chancellor's gown shall be of the same material as the Chancellor's but with silver braid on the facing instead of gold and a black silk velvet trencher with silver button and tassel.



LIEUTENANT GENERAL THE HONOURABLE ROMÉO A. DALLAIRE, O.C., C.M.M., G.O.C., M.S.C., C.D.



Lieutenant General the Honourable Roméo A. Dallaire, (retired), Senator, has had a distinguished career in the Canadian military, achieving the rank of Lieutenant General and becoming Assistant Deputy Minister (Human Resources) in the Department of National Defence in 1998. In 1994, General Dallaire commanded the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR). His book on his experiences in Rwanda, entitled Shake Hands with the Devil: The Failure of Humanity in Rwanda, was awarded the Governor General's Literary Award for Non-Fiction in 2004. It has garnered numerous international

literary awards and will be the basis of a full-length feature film scheduled to be released in 2007.

Since his retirement from the military, Senator Dallaire has worked to bring an understanding of post-traumatic stress disorder to the general public. He has also been a visiting lecturer at several Canadian and American universities, and has written several articles and chapters in publications on conflict resolution, humanitarian assistance and human rights. As a Fellow of the Carr Center for Human Rights Policy, Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, he pursued research on conflict resolution and the use of child soldiers.

Senator Dallaire has received numerous honours and awards, including Officer of the Order of Canada in 2002, Grand Officer of the National Order of Quebec in 2005 and the Aegis Award for Genocide Prevention from the Aegis Trust (United Kingdom). He has also been named a Fellow of the Ryerson Polytechnic University and an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and has received honorary doctorates from a large number of Canadian and American universities. Canada's Governor General, Her Excellency the Right Honourable Adrienne Clarkson, presented him with the United Nations Association of Canada's Pearson Peace Medal in 2005.

Lieutenant General Dallaire (retired) was appointed to the Senate effective March 24, 2005, and sits in the Senate as a member of the Liberal Party of Canada.

As a champion of human rights, his activities included: public speaking on issues relating to human rights and genocide prevention; visiting Darfur as a member of Prime Minister Martin's Special Advisory Team on Darfur; advocacy for the Canadian Forces mission to Afghanistan; membership in the United Nations Secretary General's Advisory Committee on Genocide Prevention; leadership in a project to develop a conceptual base for the elimination of the use of child soldiers; and leadership in activities aimed at the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons.

Senator Dallaire is currently researching and writing a book on the subject of child soldiers.

IRENE LILY DUBÉ



Through her entrepreneurial spirit, community service and philanthropy, Irene Dubé has set an inspiring example for business and charitable leadership in the Saskatoon community.


Irene Lily Dubé (nee Sigurdson) was born in Wynyard, Saskatchewan. In 1954, Irene married Les Dubé, and her contributions in the community began when she and her husband made their first private sector investment in 1961 with the purchase of a lot of land on 8th Street East in Saskatoon. By 1969 they opened a small business office to manage their growing company. Starting with only three employees, the Concorde Group of Companies has grown into a diverse company with extensive holdings. Irene Dubé contributed by providing general management and accounting services for the Dubés' many businesses. The Dubé success is attributed to hard work, sound business practices, and a social consciousness.

While managing the family business interests, Irene Dubé also provided service to the University of Saskatchewan, serving as a member of its Board of Governors from 1987 to 1989. Irene froze her estate in 1993, and at that point the Dubés decided to donate money accumulated from their business interests to charities. Since then, her philanthropic efforts in Saskatoon have contributed to a new wing at St. Paul's Hospital, provided finances for several other unmet needs in the area of surgery, urology and renal care, the establishment of a Breast Health Centre at Saskatoon City Hospital and the Les and Irene Dubé Community Service-Learning

Program at St. Thomas More College, an experimental style of learning that combines classroom education with volunteer service in the Saskatoon community. Among many other things, Irene Dubé's community service has also involved taking in young unwed mothers whose parents would not allow them to live at home, and providing these young women with a warm and loving home environment until their babies were born.

Irene Dubé's concern for the well-being of others and quality of life in the community demonstrates true empathy, and many have been enriched by her acts of kindness and contributions to health care, education and community service organizations. In 2006, Mrs. Dubé was inducted into the SABEX Hall of Fame, an honour presented to long standing members of the greater Saskatoon Business community. In 2006, she was recognized during the City of Saskatoon Centennial as part of the 100 Who Made a Difference for her commitment to philanthropy and entrepreneurial spirit.

LESLIE DAVID DUBÉ



Les Dubé has set an inspiring example for business and charitable leadership in the Saskatoon community. Leading by example through his strength of character and generous spirit, Mr. Dubé is a community role model whose philanthropy, community service and social investment have enriched the lives of many.

Les Dubé was born in Wynyard, Saskatchewan, and in 1954 married Irene Lily Sigurdson. As an entrepreneur, his contributions in the community began in 1961 with his first private sector investment, leading in 1969 to the opening of a small business office. Starting with only three employees, the Concorde Group of Companies has grown into a large company with diversified business ventures in Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Alberta and British Columbia.


The company started with land purchases, then building motels, apartments, warehouses and strip malls; the supply and distribution of fresh fruit and vegetables from many parts of the world for wholesale and retail food stores throughout Western Canada. Large distribution facilities are now located in British Columbia, Alberta and Manitoba serving Western Ontario through to British Columbia.

Les Dubé opted to freeze his estate in 1993, and at that point, the Dubés decided to donate money accumulated from their business interest to charities.

Les Dubé's philanthropic efforts in Saskatoon have contributed to a new wing at St. Paul's Hospital, funding the only lithotripter (for pulverizing kidney stones) in Saskatchewan, the Surgical Special Care Units and the Urology Centre of Health at St. Paul's, the establishment of a Breast Health Centre at Saskatoon City Hospital and the Les and Irene Dubé Community Service-Learning Program at St. Thomas More College. Les Dubé has held a number of leadership positions with charities and non-profit organizations in Saskatchewan including the Heart & Stroke Foundation, the Knights of Columbus, The Saskatchewan Diabetes Association, and others too numerous to mention. Of particular note are the Dubés' contributions to the James P. Mahoney Institute of the Family. Mr. Dubé served on the inaugural Board of the Saskatoon Economic Development Authority, now SREDA, and his contribution to the early development of the Authority is considered instrumental in its success. With a strong service commitment to the health sector, he chaired the St. Paul's Hospital Board of Management from 1989–1994, and was a founding member of the Saskatoon Health Authority. His many directorships include service as Director and Executive Council Member of the Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce, and as a member of the Board of Governors of St. Thomas More College.

Les Dubé was inducted into the SABEX Hall of Fame in 2006 and was recognized during the City of Saskatoon Centennial as part of the 100 Who Made a Difference for his commitment to philanthropy and entrepreneurial spirit.

HAROLD (HAL) EDMUND WYATT



Harold Edmund Wyatt was born and educated in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. He served with the RCAF as a pilot for four and a half years during World War II, retiring with the rank of Flight Lieutenant.

Mr. Wyatt has enjoyed a long and influential career in Canadian business ventures and volunteered time and energy to the many communities in which he has lived. He was a career banker with the Royal Bank of Canada, retiring in 1986 as Vice-Chairman and Director. He was also Chairman of Monsanto Canada Inc. and Liquid Carbonic Inc., Deputy Chairman of Talisman Energy Inc. (formerly BP Canada Inc.) and National Mutual Royal Bank (Australia) and Capel Court (Australia). In addition, Mr. Wyatt has served as a director for a multitude of institutions including Albert College, Concordia University and Banff School of Management. He also chaired the University of Calgary fundraising drive for their business school then known as Scurfield Hall. As Chairman and Governor of the University of Saskatchewan, he chaired many of its committees and was the University's representative on the Collaborative Committee of the Canadian Light Source Project.

Hal Wyatt has always been a driving force within every institution to which he has committed his time and considerable talents, and is highly regarded as an involved and effective business leader in philanthropic work. In Calgary he currently serves as Chairman Emeritus of the Mount Royal College Foundation, founding Chairman of the Calgary International Organ Festival, Chairman of The Stan Waters Memorial Foundation, Director of Cantos Music Foundation and he is a former Director of the Esther Honens International Piano Competition. As Governor and Vice-Chairman of the Council of Canadian Unity, Mr. Wyatt co-chaired the fundraising committee for the Terry Fox Youth Centre in Ottawa. Serving as a trustee and/or board member, Mr. Wyatt represented the American Management Association, the Pacific Basin Economic Council, Asian Pacific Foundation, The Royal Canadian Geographical Society (as a Fellow), St. Mary's Hospital (Montreal), Calgary Philharmonic Society, the Schenley Awards, and the Calgary Winter Festival. Within the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, he served as National Chairman as well as chairman of a number of national and international committees. He was a founding member of B.C.N.I. (now known as the Canadian Council of Chief Executives). Because of these activities, he was a frequent participant in Canadian trade missions. He served as co-Chairman of the Calgary Economic Development Authority and chaired the Province of Alberta's Economic Study 'Toward the Year 2000'.

Mr. Wyatt is a Member of the Order of Canada, and was also awarded the Silver Jubilee Medal 1977 and the Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of Confederation 1992. He is the first recipient of the University of Calgary's International Businessman's Award and in 2005 was again honoured to be selected as a first recipient of the noteworthy Canadian Unity Council's Outstanding Canadian Award.

LORNA JEAN CROZIER



Lorna Crozier was born in Swift Current, Saskatchewan. She received her B.A. in English and Psychology from the University of Saskatchewan in 1969 and her Saskatchewan Teacher's Certificate in 1970. As a child growing up in a prairie community where the local heroes were hockey players and curlers, she "never once thought of being a writer." Lorna went on to teach high school English and work as a guidance counsellor. During these years, Lorna published her first poem in Grain magazine, a publication that turned her life toward writing. Her first collection *Inside in the Sky* was published in 1976. Since then, she has authored 14 books of poetry, including The Garden Going on Without Us, Angels of Flesh, Angels of

Silence, Inventing the Hawk, winner of the 1992 Governor-General's Award, Everything Arrives at the Light, Apocrypha of Light, What the Living Won't Let Go, and most recently Whetstone. Whether Lorna is writing about angels, aging, or Louis Armstrong's trout sandwich, she continues to engage readers and writers across Canada and the world with her grace, wisdom and wit. She is, as Margaret Laurence wrote, "a poet to be grateful for."

Since the beginning of her writing career, Lorna has been known for her inspired teaching and mentoring of other poets. Lorna was the writer-in-residence at the Cypress Hills Community College in Swift Current, the Regina Public Library and the University of Toronto. She has held short-term residencies at the Universities of Toronto and Lethbridge and at Douglas College. Presently she lives near Victoria, where she teaches and serves as Chair in the Writing Department at the University.

Lorna has also edited two non-fiction collections—*Desire in Seven Voices* and *Addiction: Notes from the Belly of the Beast.* Together with her husband and fellow poet Patrick Lane, she edited the 1994 landmark collection *Breathing Fire: Canada's New Poets;* in 2004, they co-edited *Breathing Fire* 2, once again introducing more than thirty new writers to the Canadian literary world.

Her poems continue to be widely anthologized, appearing in 15 *Canadian Poets X 3, 20th Century Poetry and Poetics, Poetry International* and most recently in *Open Field: An Anthology of Contemporary Canadian Poets,* a collection designed for American readers.

Her reputation as a generous and inspiring artist extends from her passion for the craft of poetry to her teaching and through to her involvement in various social causes. In addition to leading poetry workshops across the globe, Lorna has given benefit readings for numerous organizations. She has been a frequent guest on CBC radio where she once worked as a reviewer and arts show host.

Her many honours for her writing and teaching include twice winning the league of Canadian Poets Pat Lowther Award for the best book of poems by a Canadian woman, the Dorothy Livesay Prize (the B.C. Book Prize for Poetry), the National Magazine gold medal, and first prize in the National CBC Literary Competition. She received an honorary Doctorate of Laws from the University of Regina, the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Alberta and was named a Distinguished Professor at the University of Victoria.

CALVIN (CAL) RALPH STILLER



Dr. Stiller is an internationally famed physician, scientist and entrepreneur, who was raised in Naicam, Saskatchewan and obtained his medical degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1965 and his F.R.C.P. (C) in 1970 following postgraduate studies in London and Edmonton. Dr. Stiller is currently Professor Emeritus in the Department of Medicine at the University of Western Ontario and Chair of Genome Canada and the Ontario Innovation Trust.

In 1972, Dr. Stiller launched London's organ transplant program and became one of the world's leading clinical investigators in transplantation. This program was, and still is, at the leading edge of the transplantation field. From 1984 to 1996, he served as the unit's chief. During this period, he was also principal investigator of the Canadian multi-centre study that established the importance of Cyclosporine in transplantation and led to its worldwide use as first-line therapy for transplant rejection. He pioneered the use of immunosuppressive therapy in type I diabetes and was the first to confirm the role of the immune system in human type I diabetes. As a leading researcher, he has published some 265 scientific and medical papers, co-edited five books, and authored the book *Lifegifts*.

Professionally, Dr. Stiller has served as President of the Canadian Society of Nephrology and on numerous professional and government committees. He co-founded the Multiple Organ Retrieval and Exchange Program, the J. Allyn Taylor International Prize in Medicine, the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame, Robarts Research Institute, MaRS and the Ontario Institute for Cancer Research and has been active in a number of charitable organizations. Dr. Stiller also co-chaired the first International Congress on Ethics in Transplantation.

As a businessman and entrepreneur, Dr. Stiller was keenly aware that Canada was sadly deficient in the mechanisms and resources to exploit our fundamental biological discoveries in the marketplace. As a result, he co-founded four venture capital funds, the Canadian Medical Discoveries Fund, Canadian Science and Technology Growth Fund, CMDF II, and Starting Startups Venture Fund. He sits on the boards of numerous public foundations and companies.

Among Dr. Stiller's many awards and honours are the MEDEC Award of Canada in 1992; the first Distinguished Scientist award for International Medical Contributions from the University of Saskatchewan in 1993; and the first President's Merit Award of the Medical Research Council of Canada in 1995. In 1995 Dr. Stiller was named as a Member of the Order of Canada and in 2003, a Member of the Order of Ontario. In 1999, the Novartis/Calvin Stiller Chair in Xenotransplantation at the University of Western Ontario was announced in his honour. Dr. Stiller received the Distinguished Service Award of the Friends of Canadian Institutes of Health Research in 2002. He received an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from McMaster University in Hamilton in 2003.

In 1998 Dr. Stiller was named by the Premier of the Province of Ontario as Chair of the Ontario Research and Development Challenge Fund and a Director of the Ontario Innovation Trust.

JEREMY LEE



Born and raised in Northern England, Jeremy Lee was awarded a scholarship in 1971 to study natural sciences at Cambridge University and received a B.A. in chemistry in 1974. Three years later, he completed a Ph.D. in pharmacology. His thesis title was *The Binding of Antibiotics to DNA* research that marked the beginning of a lifelong interest in the structure and function of nucleic acids.

After spending four years working in a university biochemistry lab in

Edmonton, Dr. Lee became a landed immigrant in 1980. In 1982, he moved to Saskatoon to take up a position at the U of S as assistant professor of biochemistry.

His initial research focus was analysis of monoclonal antibodies that bind to proteins, DNA or RNA. By 1987, he had succeeded in preparing unique antibodies which bind specifically to three-stranded DNA, showing that the chromosomes of eukaryotes—the same broad group of organisms that includes humans—contained this unusual structure.

In 1997, he was the first to convert an antibody that binds to RNA into a nuclease that cuts RNA into pieces by the modification of a single amino acid. But it was the unexpected discovery of another unusual DNA structure in 1992, called M-DNA, which has dominated his research for the last 15 years.

M-DNA has a metal ion in the middle of the DNA helix which causes the DNA to become a conductor of electrons rather than an insulator. With a diameter of only two nanometers, M-DNA may be the smallest wire imaginable. Indeed a simple transistor with dimensions of only 10 nanometres has been constructed in Dr. Lee's lab.


Potential applications include M-DNA-based diagnostic tools that would quickly yield information on genetic disease and bacterial infection—perhaps even providing answers to doctors before the end of a patient's visit. Adnavance Technologies Inc. was founded in 2002 in order to exploit this possibility, with Dr. Lee serving as the company's chief scientific officer.

Dr. Lee is proud of the fact that he has never taken a biochemistry course in his life and yet has taught the subject for 25 years to medical and graduate students and in the undergraduate biochemistry program.

He was honoured with the College of Medicine basic sciences teaching award in 1990 and 1995. His love of teaching is matched only by his dislike of PowerPoint and he can frequently be found walking around campus covered in chalk dust.

Distinguished Researcher Award

GREGG ADAMS



The Distinguished Researcher Award recognizes a faculty member's contribution to scholarship through creation, expansion, and critique of knowledge. Dr. Gregg P. Adams, Professor of Veterinary Biomedical Sciences at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine, is the recipient of the Spring 2007 award.

Dr. Adams' outstanding work has had significant impact in the field of reproductive biology. His groundbreaking research has led to more than 15 scientific "firsts."

He has worked with a wide variety of

mammals, including many endangered species, and has also worked to develop models applicable to humans. His collaborative research with the College of Medicine discovered that women, like some mammals, experience two to three "follicular waves" per menstrual cycle. This finding, with its profound implication for both contraception and assisted reproduction, was identified as one of the Top 100 Science Stories in 2003 by Discover magazine.

Over his distinguished 25-year career as a veterinarian, researcher and educator at the U of S, Dr. Adams has authored or co-authored more than 100 papers in refereed journals as well as writing chapters in books and review articles. Dr. Adams presents his findings at international, national and regional conferences.

Lauded as a world-class researcher by his colleagues, Dr. Adams' novel research program, leadership and dedication are his signature within the scientific and lay communities.

As the leader of the University's successful bid for the Biomedical Imaging and Therapy beamline at the Canadian Light Source, he has helped give biological sciences researchers across campus the opportunity for great advancements with this powerful new technology.

A hallmark of Dr. Adams' leadership is never asking others to do anything he would not do himself. His teammates often find him teaching in the field, taking unpopular shifts in large-scale projects, and developing new approaches to facilitate research and clinical work.

Dr. Adams' drive and passion is apparent from his lengthy record of scholarly achievement as well as his devoted mentorship of his students. Over the course of his career, he has mentored 25 graduate students and supervised more than 30 summer students.

Dr. Adams earned a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the U of S in 1982 after completing pre-veterinary classes in biology in 1978. He continued his studies at the University of Wisconsin, earning his Master's degree in 1987, clinical specialization in 1988, and his Ph.D. in 1991.

VIPEN SAWHNEY



Professor Vipen Sawhney provides a perfect example of the teacher-scholar envisaged in the mission statement of the University of Saskatchewan. Over the past 30 plus years, Professor Sawhney has established a reputation as an outstanding teacher, all the while dispatching administrative tasks with ease and maintaining a first rate research program, with a co-edited book and over 100 refereed papers to his credit.

A perusal of comments from teaching questionnaires and letters from

students reveals an amazing teacher. Professor Sawhney's lectures, which combine overhead transparencies, videos, stories, humorous anecdotes and colourful PowerPoint presentations capture the imagination of his students and make biology come alive. Each of Vipen's lectures is a model of organization and clarity, but Vipen's trademark is his dedication to and enthusiasm for biology, particularly plants. His impact on undergraduate students is captured in the following quotation from a first year student. "Indeed, we all knew that he loved biology and that though his specialty was plants, he too had a favourite animal: the elephant. We also saw that he was quite a dancer, as he tried to show us how the living cell was not static, but rather dynamic. It was this passion for his work that first caught my attention." And later in the same letter, " So how has this affected my life as a student? It gave me a new sense of confidence. Dr. Sawhney turned me on to learning and really thinking rather than simply studying to ace an exam".

Equally important to Professor Sawhney's passion for biology is his compassion for his students. He truly cares for them and wants them to achieve, not only in his biology classes, but in life. A former graduate student wrote: "He always took a personal interest in his students, ensuring newcomers to the city/country were welcomed and comfortable. A central gathering table was a focal part of the laboratory. This provided a relaxed atmosphere and encouraged the interchange between people of different cultural and religious backgrounds, thus providing more than just a scientific education". A biology colleague put it this way, "Beyond the actual technique of teaching, I believe that Vipen's attitude toward his students is the major factor contributing to his efforts. He treats them with respect and in every way encourages them to expend their best effort to obtain the maximum benefit from their work. His approach to them is open and friendly and he is always ready to offer help and support to anyone who experiences difficulties."

Vipen Sawhney is a truly gifted teacher. But perhaps more importantly, he is a fine human being. He is kind and thoughtful, and always strives to improve the lives of those around him.

LISA VARGO



Dr. Lisa Vargo is an individual whose contributions to literacy and volunteerism have contributed greatly and with distinction to the University's outreach and engagement mission.

Dr. Vargo is an Associate Professor of English specializing in romantic literature. She is an alumna of Mount Holyoke College and the University of Toronto. She joined the faculty at the University of Saskatchewan in 1990. In her academic life, Dr. Vargo teaches introductory and senior undergraduate courses, specializing in British romanticism. Her research interests include women writers of the Romantic period, especially Mary Shelley's writings.

In addition to enhancing the academic environment of the University of Saskatchewan, Dr. Vargo has made an exceptional contribution to literacy in the province and beyond. Her interest in literacy began in Toronto where she served as a literacy worker for a communitybased learning centre. She also volunteered with an adult learning program in Peterborough, Ontario. Upon her arrival in Saskatoon, Dr. Vargo joined READ Saskatoon and has served as a tutor for the past 17 years. She has served on the board of directors and twice assumed the presidency of the organization. She was involved with the Word Whiz fundraiser for the Saskatchewan Literacy Foundation and served on the board of the Saskatchewan Literacy Network. In 1999, she received the Saskatchewan Literacy Award of Merit for her volunteerism and in 2004 was

awarded the Canada Post Literacy Award as an educator.

Dr. Vargo has been described as "energetic, inspirational and indefatigable in her dedication to literacy." Others have said that "she brings a deep understanding of the complexities of literacy and of human justice to the way she works with learners and to the way she helps organizations develop respectful and fair policies and practices for volunteers and staff." One of her students said "I am so proud of the person that I am today. I know with my whole heart that it has everything to do with Lisa Vargo." She has demonstrated a sustained commitment to use her expertise in ways that engage individuals and groups beyond the borders of the campus, and she has enhanced the University's reputation in exceptional ways.

Dr. Vargo's outreach and engagement activities have had substantial impact and long-term significance, and she is truly deserving of the University of Saskatchewan's Award for Distinction in Outreach and Engagement.

VAL ARNAULT-PELLETIER



The numbers tell the story—in 2000, the Native Access Program to Nursing (NAPN) at the University of Saskatchewan supported 58 Aboriginal students. This year, that number doubled, to 117, more than any other nursing education program in Canada. People who have watched this growth say it would not have happened without Val Arnault-Pelletier.

Arnault-Pelletier, a Cree woman who is a member of Beardy's Okemasis First Nation, has served for the past 10 years as lead student advisor in the Native Access Program in the College of Nursing (NAPN). Her work managing the program and expanding the vision of increased numbers of Aboriginal people in health-care careers and balanced, healthy Aboriginal communities has earned Arnault-Pelletier the University's President's Service Award.

A graduate of Loon Lake High School and the Saskatoon Business College, Arnault-Pelletier came to the University in 1994. Among her achievements in NAPN is the development of valuable relationships between the University and the community, all of which benefit the program as well as the students who become part of the circle of support. Recently, she has been engaged in expanding NAPN to include students from the College of Medicine, which is dedicated to increasing the number of Aboriginal physicians. As a result, NAPN is now known as Native Access Program to Nursing/Medicine or NAPN/M.

Those who know Arnault-Pelletier describe her as tenacious and creative in seeking out funding for the program and its projects. Her work has earned both Arnault-Pelletier and the University a national and international profile. She is sought after to consult with organizations dedicated, as she is, to recruiting and retaining Aboriginal students and has been a conference presenter at local and regional events.

While recruiting is one aspect of her work, ensuring students continue through their training and into careers is also a focus for Arnault-Pelletier. She and the NAPN staff provide a great deal of support to students throughout their education, including culturally appropriate counselling, academic advising, and financial, personal and academic advocacy. This work also encompasses a few international students who are in need of a community with which to identify.

Always a person who looks to the future, Arnault-Pelletier is working on funding proposals, updating the NAPN/M website to maximize its recruiting potential, and expanding the program's database with an eye to providing better quality student services. One of her recent initiatives is a collaborative project with Muskoday First Nation to start a summer science camp at the U of S for Aboriginal students.

The numbers do tell the story, but they are only one of many stories that demonstrate why Val Arnault-Pelletier is such a deserving recipient of the President's Service Award. These medals are awarded to the undergraduate student and graduate student with the highest academic standing.

Gold Medal TARA GARIEPY

Tara Gariepy was born in Montreal, Quebec in 1974. Tara received a Bachelor of Science in Biology in 1998 from Concordia University in Montreal. She pursued graduate studies at Simon Fraser University (Burnaby, British Columbia) where she studied molecular diagnostics and epidemiology of fungal pathogens. Tara received a Masters of Pest Management degree in 2002, and won the B.P. Beirne Prize in Pest Management. Tara then worked at CABI Europe-Switzerland as a project entomologist on a variety of insect biological control programmes. In 2003, Tara started her Ph.D. research in the Department of Biology at the University of Saskatchewan. She was the recipient of the Margaret Mackay Scholarship and an NSERC Canada Graduate Scholarship. Tara completed her Doctor of Philosophy degree in 2007.

Tara's thesis research presents some of the novel ways in which molecular techniques can be used in classical biological control programmes for insect pests. Molecular diagnostic techniques help address some of the key ecological questions that arise when exotic biological control agents are imported into a new environment. Techniques that allow a better understanding of trophic and guild interactions among natural enemies will improve the success and safety of biological control programmes for economically important pests.

Tara has been awarded an NSERC post-doctoral fellowship, and will continue research on molecular diagnostics in basic and applied ecology.

Silver Medal PHILLIP DESAUTELS

Phillip was raised in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan and graduated from Walter Murray Collegiate with High Honours in 2002. He graduates with a Bachelor of Science in Engineering Physics (with Great Distinction) and with a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (with Great Distinction). Phillip is the recipient of the 2007 Spring Convocation Gold Medal from the Association of Professional Engineers & Geoscientists of Saskatchewan, for the most distinguished graduate in the College of Engineering and the Dr. E.L. Harrington Prize, the Engineering Physics Distinguished Graduate Award.

He has received numerous awards and scholarships during his academic career at the U of S. Walter C. Murray First U of S President – 1908-1937

Following are excperts from a speech delivered in 1946 by Grant MacEwan, former Professor of Animal Husbandry at the U of S:

"I don't suppose anybody left a more vivid mark upon the youthful face of Western Canada than the late Walter C. Murray. It wasn't just what he did but it was the "Murray way" he had of doing it that made him loved. He distinguished himself as a philosopher and he was a great educator; yes, but more than that, he was distinguished for his tremendous capacity for friendship; he was a great Canadian.

Walter Charles Murray was born at Studholm in King' s County, New Brunswick, on May 12, 1866. From the local schools, young Murray went to the University of New Brunswick and graduated in 1886, a distinguished gold medalist. He was awarded a scholarship which permitted him to pursue graduate studies overseas and he elected philosophy at the University of Edinburgh. Leaving Edinburgh he travelled in Europe and studied in Berlin and then returned to become Professor of Philosophy at his own University of New Brunswick. Dalhousie University wanted him and got him in 1892, and there he remained until 1908 when he accepted the challenge of the new North West.

Murray had a vision of a provincial University dedicated to service, a vision of a peoples' University. It was to be the servant of an agricultural area, conducting useful research, and turning out able leaders; and raising cultural standards.

Dr. Murray's relationship to his students was

extremely happy. He got along well with them. He could call most of them by name and actually he knew a great deal about the problems confronting them individually.

No one enjoyed good humor more than Murray and there was no lack of originality in his own. The first two dormitories on his campus, Saskatchewan Hall and Qu'Appelle Hall, were called after two rivers in the province. He threatened to call the next one Carrot Hall. It was his observation that "the modern pastime known as necking had done more to discourage the habit of tobacco chewing than a thousand years of reform."

In training, Walter Murray was a philosopher but all through the years, nothing gave him greater satisfaction than his associations with agriculture. In the formative years, he conferred with Dean Rutherford in the planning of the University barns and the laying out of the fields. And he watched the horses and cattle and sheep, and pigs. He loved the growing things; he enjoyed nothing more than to stroll through the barns and talk to the horses.

And while he had that great interest in animals, he had a great and sympathetic love for people. If there was a Santa Claus in Saskatoon, his other name was Murray, and in those years of depression, no one will ever know how much aid and assistance he gave, and nearly always anonymously.

When Walter Murray died on March 23, 1945, age 79, men and women in all provinces and in all walks of life, mourned his going. They mourned the passing of one of God's gentlemen, a noble Canadian, a man who loved his fellows and lived to make Canada a better place."

46th Canadian Infantry Battalion 1914-1918

A memorial stone and plaque honouring the memory of those who served with the 46th Canadian Infantry Battalion (South Saskatchewan), Canadian Expeditionary Force, 1914-1918, rests under a tree on the northeast corner of the Bowl. "Designed by a well known sculptor of Winnipeg", it was presented to the University at a solemn ceremony in Convocation Hall on November 11, 1933.

The Great War exacted a heavy toll on the U of S. Of the 336 students, faculty and staff who enlisted, 67 "passed out of the sight of man by the path of duty and self-sacrifice".


More than 100 more were wounded and 33 were awarded medals of valour. The School of Engineering closed its doors for the 1916-1917 session when the faculty and students enlisted en masse.

Formed in February of 1915, the 46th Canadian Infantry Battalion (South Saskatchewan) was to have a strength of 600 men. Its ranks were filled primarily with Saskatchewan youth, many via the U of S.

Also known as the "Suicide Battalion", it fought in some of the bloodiest encounters of the war. Reinforcements were constantly needed as battle after battle decimated its ranks. Of the 5,374 men in the 46th Battalion, 4,917 were either killed or wounded.

A particularly costly battle was Passchendaele, where there were 403 casualties from the Battalion's strength of 600 men. With the end of the war came demobilization and the end of 46th Battalion. The soldiers became veterans and returned to civilian life. Many re-enrolled or entered the University for the first time.

Many others did not return. Among those honoured on the plaque are Harold Blair and Reginald Batemen, two members of faculty killed in France.



The history of the 196th Western Universities Battalion No. 5 Platoon, pictured above in 1916, was brief. Once in England it was broken up to reinforce existing units. A high portion of the recruits eventually found themselves in the officers' ranks. Others found themselves assigned to Saskatchewan dominated 46th—the "Suicide Battalion." A-1130

In 1999, the University of Saskatchewan learned it would be home to the largest scientific project ever undertaken in Canada: the Canadian Light Source (CLS). The announcement generated a great deal of excitement about the University's future as a world leader in research and synchrotron science. But it is important to note that the building of the CLS and the selection of our campus as its home were not random events, but the result of a series of historic developments on campus.

The Department of Physics early on had built for itself a reputation based upon experimentation and innovation. The post-war period saw the U of S in the forefront of nuclear physics in Canada.

In 1948, Canada's first betatron (and the world's first used in the treatment of cancer) was installed on campus. It was used for research programs in nuclear physics, radiation chemistry, cancer therapy and radiation biology. Next the world's first non-commercial cobalt-60 therapy unit for the treatment of cancer was officially opened in 1951.

With this unit research was undertaken in the areas of radiological physics, radiation chemistry and the effects of high energy radiation on plants and animals.

When the construction of the Linear Accelerator (Linac) was announced in the fall of 1961, it was portrayed as the next logical step on the University's research path. The 80-foot electron accelerator tube was to create energy six times that of the betatron.

The cost of the \$1,750,000 Linac facility was split between the National Research Council and the University of Saskatchewan, with the NRC meeting the cost of the equipment and the University assuming the costs of the building.

The official opening in early November of 1964 was more than just a few speeches and the cutting of a ribbon. It was a physics-fest, with 75 visiting scientist from around the world in attendance presenting papers and giving lectures over the period of several days. Three eminent physicists were granted honorary degrees at the Fall Convocation and hundreds of people showed up for the public open house.

The greatest U of S football squad?

As each new football season begins and the hopes for another championship are high, many a fan casts their mind back to the glories of years past. Which version of the gridiron Huskies was our greatest?

To many the 1998 Vanier Cup championship team would be the prime candidate, but according to an article in the November 2, 1922 Sheaf, it was the 1914 team, Champions of Northern Saskatchewan.

Football, called rugby at the time, began to be played on campus in the 1911-12 season. The game was regionally very popular, with the U of S being only one of several Saskatoon-based teams. The 1914-15 squad was the first official varsity team, although inter-university play did not begin until 1922.

The 1914 team had a splendid season, only to suffer a loss (called "a valuable lesson") to Regina in the provincial final.

The Regina Leader describes it as follows: "Though vanquished, the students were by no means disgraced, the plucky showing which they put up against their more experienced rivals resulting in giving the Regina fans what was conceded to be the best game of the season. Holding the local champions scoreless during the first quarter, the visitors combined confidence with pluck, and, although they were gradually mowed down by their heavier and infinitely betterschooled opponents, they stuck to the fight with grim and determined obstinacy that was deserving of something better than a scoreless effort."

They were, however, not destined to become a football dynasty. The conflict in Europe depleted their ranks and scattered the survivors. The 1922 Sheaf asked the question which Huskie fans ask every year, "Can we produce another squad of winners?"

Lights out at Eleven: Life in Residence

The first student residence was completed on the University of Saskatchewan campus in 1912. The University had made a decision to have a residence rather than fraternity system for their student housing, believing residences were more democratic. Until the 1970s the residences were segregated. Men and women were only allowed to visit one another during certain hours, and strict curfews were in place.

The following is a list of rules that were in place in the women's residences in 1948—50 years ago.

- 1. Silence is essential during study hours, from 7:30 to 10 p.m. Only important telephone messages will be delivered during these hours.
- 2. After 10:30 p.m., the Residence must be quiet.
- 3. The doors will be locked at 11 p.m. Girls going out in the evening must, before they leave, sign their names and the hour at which they expect to return.

Each Senior and Junior will be granted 10 late passes; each sophomore and Freshette, five per month. No late leave granted on Sunday.

- 4. Permission to spend the night out of Residence is granted only in special circumstances, and under the following conditions: For all students, the parent's written permission must be given to the Warden to allow students to stay with specified hostesses.
- 5. Girls may entertain gentlemen in the Common Room between the hours of 1 and 2 p.m.; 5:30 and 11 p.m.
- 6. The piano may be used from 12:45 to 1:30 p.m. and from 5 to 7:30 p.m. every day, and after 12:45 p.m. on Saturdays, and after 11 a.m. on Sundays.
- 7. It is forbidden to talk out of the windows.
