FUNDING

All Canadian (or P.R.) undergraduate students in Arts and Science may be eligible for the Global Skills Opportunity funding. If eligible, students may receive up to \$2000* toward the program fees. (*students who have received the GSO previously are not eligible). This project is partially funded by the Government of Canada's Outbound Student Mobility Pilot Program.

COST OF PROGRAM: per student

USask tuition: approx. <u>~\$1434</u> for 6-credit units (students register and pay tuition as usual) Program fee: ~\$3220

• Program fee includes accommodations, admission fees, on-site transportation/buses, some meals.

PREREQUISITES:

3 credit units ARCH, ARTH, CLAS, CMRS, HIST, or 45 credit units of University courses and permission of the instructor. Students must also have a minimum of 30 cu and an overall average no lower than 65%.





COURSE DESCRIPTION

Led by Dr Tracence Harvey, Director, Museum of Antiquities, this study abroad course focuses on the urban development and architecture of ancient Rome. Rome and other ancient cities such as Pompeii and Herculaneum, serve as the classroom in our exploration of architecture, urbanism, and life in the ancient city. Subjects of study include: ancient urban planning; religion in urban space, palaces, and private homes; the architecture of entertainment, politics and monumentality; and many more. This course will be of interest to students who would like the opportunity to expand their knowledge of ancient cities and their urban culture.

To maximize students' experience, we begin with 4 days of classroom seminars in Saskatoon. Once in Italy, we will start with a long weekend in the Bay of Naples region to visit Pompeii and Herculaneum, the cities buried by Vesuvius. The majority of our course time we'll spend in Rome, the Eternal city. Mornings, the city will be our classroom and we'll study sites, monuments and museums. Most afternoons, students will be free to explore Rome's eternal secrets on their own.

COURSE OVERVIEW

This 3- 1/2-week intensive, lecture-seminar study abroad class takes place in Italy every two years and focuses on the study of ancient Rome. Architecture, urban planning, monuments and authority, aspects of everyday life in urban environments, Christianity in urban space, are some of the subjects that we cover, in the classroom, and site visits in the city of Rome, and elsewhere. This course will be of special benefit to students of classics, history, CMRS, archaeology, art and art history, urban planning, museum studies, architecture and engineering.
