### FUNDING

All Canadian (or P.R.) undergraduate students in Arts and Science may be eligible for the Global Skills Opportunity funding. If eligible, students may receive up to \$2000\* toward the program fees. (\*students who have received the GSO previously are not eligible).

### **COST OF PROGRAM: per student**

USask tuition: approx. <u>~\$689.40</u> for 3 credit units (students register and pay tuition as usual) Program fee: ~\$2,250

Personal expenses: ~\$500

# **PREREQUISITES:**

GEOG 240.3 or 12 c.u. of Social Science and/or Humanities or permission of the instructor. Note: This course is offered as a taught-abroad opportunity only. It involves extensive outdoor physical activity (walking, cycling.

Students must also have a minimum of 30 cu and an overall average no lower than 65%.



### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This is an experiential learning course, whereby students are encouraged to view the city around them as a classroom and gain new knowledge through "lived and shared experiences". This course explores the various ways in which the public realm has been privileged over the realm of the private vehicle to achieve a wide array of be benefits that includes public comfort, health and wellbeing, safety and enjoyment. It looks at how cities' urban design elements, urban form aspects, and active transportation components have been integrated to achieve the previous goals.

Students will experience, first-hand, humanistic urban design from innovative public works, people-centered pedestrian streets, plazas, urban playgrounds, parks, and amenities to bicycle, pedestrian and transit elements and networks. The course will take place in one of the most bikeable cities in the world, Amsterdam, which makes it a template for what is possible for other cities around the world.

# **COURSE OVERVIEW**

The purpose of the course is to help students develop their understanding of the humanistic urban design strategies and active transportation planning concepts that can be used to improve people's experiences and contribute to the overall health and wellbeing of society.
