FUNDING

All eligible Canadian undergraduate students in Arts and Science will have the program fee reduced by up to \$5,000 (depending on eligibility). This amount will be applied toward: flights (to and from Saskatoon), accommodations, host university program fees, and scheduled field trips (student who have previously been awarded the GSO are not eligible).

COST OF PROGRAM: per student

USask tuition: approx. **~\$2,150** for 9 credit units (students register and pay USask tuition as usual)

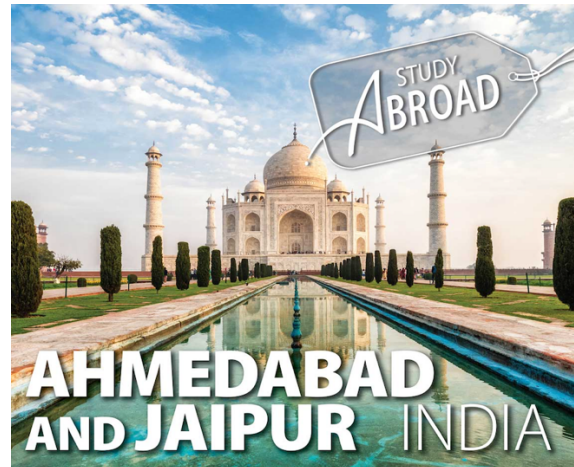
Program fee (after GSO award): ~\$5,000

- **Students who don't qualify for GSO: \$11,500**
- Program fee includes: flights to and from Saskatoon, accommodations, museums/theatres, on-site transportation, some meals.

Visas: ~\$300

Immunizations: ~\$400

Personal expenses: ~\$600



COURSE DESCRIPTION

India is a land of contrasts where mysticism and ancient civilizations coexist with innovation and vibrant cosmopolitanism. This program introduces students to India and its role in the global society through a study of its politics, economy, culture and history. Students will participate in numerous field trips, take courses taught by both Canadian and Indian instructors, and study alongside their Indian counterparts.

COURSE OVERVIEW

The India semester abroad program will provide students with an in-depth international, cross-cultural experience. Students will visit a number of cities, including Delhi and Agra, but will spend most of their time at the Indian Institute of Technology, Gandhinagar, (IITGN), in Ahmedabad with a two-week study period at Banasthali Vidyapith (India's largest women-only institution) near Jaipur. Having experiences at two different Universities will deepen their understanding of the country's intellectual environment as well as cultures, and traditions. Reinforcing this learning is the fact that students will live on campus with their Indian peers, dine with them, and study and socialize with them. In addition, they will be taught by prominent Indian academics and have guest lectures by NGO activists. Further, they will visit sites of historic, political and cultural significance.
