

# **2019/20** tuition rates

#### **The facts on tuition**

In the 2019/20 academic year, tuition rates will change by an overall average of 3.4 per cent. The university uses tuition revenue combined with the provincial operating grant to:

- ensure the ongoing programmatic offerings of the university;
- fund specific enhancements in programs, student services, and the student experience; and
- set aside needs-based assistance for students who have modest financial resources.

Our Board of Governors sets tuition rates annually based on five principles: 1) comparability to similar programs at other Canadian U15 medical-doctoral universities; 2) accessibility and affordability for the majority of potential students; 3) the enabling quality of our programs and the need to ensure our students receive a high-quality education; 4) predictability of tuition to support longer-term planning for students; and 5) transparency through consultation with students to ensure a common understanding on tuition.

Rates in the table above reflect a typical domestic student course offering within the program. International undergraduate tuition rates are 2.73 times the domestic undergraduate rate. International graduate tuition rates are 1.58 times the domestic graduate rate.

For full-time undergraduate students, a typical student's program includes classes offered by different colleges, so the average tuition cost to studentsmay reflect a blended rate of different tuition categories. For graduate students, a typical student is enrolled on-campus in a full-time thesis program and taking three terms per year. The standard term rate of changemayapply to some special graduate tuition programs, but not to all.

In addition to tuition, students also pay a variety of student fees that are used to fund specific student benefits offered as part of a university education.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> In fall 2015, all new MPA students were required to complete a 12-course program. Those admitted prior to fall 2015 will remain in the 10-course program and pay a program fee of \$14,077.00.

<sup>4</sup> Prior to 2019/20, the Joint Master of Governance and Entrepreneurship in Northern and Indigenous Areas (GENI) tuition was assessed at the graduate standard term-based rate.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Prior to 2019/20, the Post-Graduate Certificate – Nurse Practitioner tuition was assessed at the graduate standard course-based rate.

<sup>6</sup> The differential multiplier is calculated based on the current rate, but not applied to students covered by contractual agreement (also not applied to students enrolled in programs in Johnson-Shoyama Graduate School of Public Policy). The differential multiplier applicable to non-degree distance education certificate programs is 1.5 times the domestic rate. International students enrolled in the PharmD program pay the domestic rate of tuition.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> International per term fee is increased to align with the current U of R rate and is applied to the following programs in the Johnson-Shoyama Graduate School of Public Policy: Graduate Certificates (Social Economy, Public Policy Analysis, Public Management, Non-Profit Management, Economic Analysis for Public Policy), Master of Public Administration, Master of Public Policy, and Ph.D. in Public Policy. International students enrolled in the GENI program pay the domestic rate of tuition.
